- Section 1. (a) A state agency shall receive 50

 percent of the patent proceeds of a state employee who has

 developed an invention, product, process, idea, concept,

 procedure, innovation, or works of authorship and their

 associated materials within the scope of his or her

 employment.
 - (b) The proceeds received by the state agency pursuant to subsection (a) shall be deposited into the State General Fund.
 - Section 2. (a) An education institution shall receive 50 percent of the patent proceeds of an education employee who has developed an invention, product, process, idea, concept, procedure, innovation, or works of authorship and their associated materials within the scope of his or her employment.
 - (b) The proceeds received by the education institution pursuant to subsection (a) shall be deposited into the Education Trust Fund.
 - Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
