8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, current and retired 9 members of the Alabama National Guard, members of 10 the United States Armed Forces reserve units, 11 members of the Civil Air Patrol, and members of 12 volunteer rescue squads are allowed an exemption 13 from state privilege or license taxes and 14 registration fees for one passenger vehicle.

15This bill would provide for the same16exemption for persons who are retired from the17United States Armed Forces and from any United18States Armed Forces reserve organization. The bill19would provide that the exemption would extend only20to United States Armed Forces retired distinctive21license plates.

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

To amend Section 40-12-244 of the Code of Alabama 1975, providing certain exemptions from motor vehicle license taxes and registration fees, to provide an exemption for retirees from the United States Armed Forces and from any United States Armed Forces reserve organization for distinctive United States Armed Forces retired license tags under certain conditions.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9 Section 1. Section 40-12-244 of the Code of Alabama
10 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§40-12-244.

12 "There shall be exempt from the operation of the 13 privilege or license tax and registration fee now or 14 hereinafter to be levied on automobiles and motor vehicles by 15 the State of Alabama one passenger vehicle owned by any of the 16 following:

17 "(1)a. An active member of the Alabama National Guard or the Alabama State Guard, when organized in lieu of 18 the National Guard or for any service-connected disabled 19 veteran. The exemption for only one vehicle extends only to 20 21 distinctive National Guard or service-connected disabled 22 veterans' license tags and shall be claimed upon presentation 23 of proper identification on forms prescribed by the Adjutant 24 General. Active members of the National Guard may obtain 25 additional distinctive license tags for other passenger 26 vehicles which they own by paying the regular privilege or 27 license tax provided by law.

1 "b. A retired member of the Alabama National Guard 2 with 20 years or more service. The exemption for only one vehicle extends only to distinctive National Guard license 3 4 tags and shall be claimed upon presentation of proper identification on forms prescribed by the Adjutant General. 5 6 Retired members of the Alabama National Guard may obtain 7 additional distinctive license tags for passenger vehicles which they own upon presentation and proper identification on 8 forms prescribed by the Adjutant General and by paying the 9 10 regular privilege or license tax and registration fee as 11 provided by law.

"(2) An officer, warrant officer, or enlisted person 12 13 serving as an active member of any United States armed forces 14 reserve organization or any service-connected disabled 15 veterans who were residents of Alabama at the time of entering the service and who are still residents of Alabama at the time 16 17 the exemption is claimed. The exemption shall be claimed by presentation of proper identification and proof of residence 18 requirements on forms prescribed by the state Department of 19 20 Revenue.

"(3) A member of a volunteer rescue squad.

"(4) The Civil Air Patrol; including those vehicles
owned by the national headquarters and those owned by the
Alabama wing of the Civil Air Patrol.

"(5) A volunteer firefighter who is a resident of
Alabama and who is entitled to the distinctive firefighter tag
issued pursuant to Section 32-6-272. The exemption for one

vehicle extends only to the firefighter distinctive license
 plate.

3	"(6) Any person who is retired from the United
4	States Armed Forces or any United States Armed Forces reserve
5	organization who is a resident of Alabama at the time the
6	exemption is claimed. The exemption shall be for only one
7	vehicle and shall extend only to distinctive United States
8	Armed Forces Retired license tags. Retired members of the
9	United States Armed Forces or any United States Armed Forces
