3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Section 22-23-35.1 is added to the Code 5 of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§22-23-35.1.

7 Any supplier of water, and its officers, directors, and employees, who the board determines is in compliance with 8 9 the regulations established pursuant to Sections 22-23-33 and 10 22-23-34, or who has obtained and is in compliance with any 11 variance or exception authorized by the board pursuant to Section 22-23-35, or who is operating under a Consent Decree 12 13 or Consent Order, shall have immunity from civil suit for injuries to person or property, whether real or personal, 14 15 tangible or intangible, direct or consequential, claimed on 16 account of the quality, purity, wholesomeness, chemistry, 17 and/or physical make-up of the water supplied. This section 18 shall not be read to impair in any way the enforcement authority of the Alabama Department of Environmental 19 20 Management under this chapter.

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 22 first day of the third month following its passage and 23 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
