8	SYNOPSIS:	This bill would establish the crimes of
9		falsely removing an instrument from recording and
10		offering a false instrument for recording against a
11		public official.
12		This bill would also allow a proceeding to
13		remove a false instrument filed by a public servant
14		to be transferred to circuit court and for the
15		proceeding to be expedited.
16		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
17		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
18		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
19		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
20		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
21		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
22		becoming effective with regard to a local
23		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
24		unless: it comes within one of a number of
25		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
26		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

13 AN ACT

To amend Section 13A-9-12 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to establish the crimes of falsely removing an instrument from recording and offering a false instrument for recording against a public servant; to provide for penalties; to provide a procedure for the removal of false instruments filed against a public official; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1	Section 1. Section 13A-9-12 of the Code of Alabama		
2	1975, is amended to read as follows:		
3	"\$13A-9-12.		
4	"(a) A person commits the crime of offering a false		
5	instrument for recording if, knowing that a written instrument		
6	relating to or affecting real or personal property, or an		
7	interest therein, or directly affecting contractual		
8	relationships contains a material false statement or material		
9	false information, and with intent to defraud, he presents or		
10	offers it to a public office or a public employee, with the		
11	knowledge that it will be registered, filed or recorded or		
12	become a part of the records of that public office or public		
13	employee.		
14	"(b) Offering a false instrument for recording is a		
15	Class A misdemeanor.		
16	"(c)(1) A public servant, as defined in Section		
17	13A-10-1, commits the crime of falsely removing an instrument		
18	from recording if, knowing that a written instrument relating		
19	to or affecting real or personal property or an interest		
20	therein or directly affecting a contractual relationship is		
21	valid, he or she attempts to have the instrument removed from		
22	recording.		
23	"(2) Falsely removing an instrument from recording		
24	is a Class C felony.		
25	"(d)(1) A person commits the crime of offering a		
26	false instrument for recording against a public servant if the		
27	person offers for recording a written instrument which relates		

to or affects the real or personal property or an interest therein or a contractual relationship of a public servant knowing that the written instrument contains a material false statement or material false information, with the intent to defraud, intimidate, or harass the public servant or to impede the public servant in the performance of his or her duties. For the purposes of this subsection, a public servant is defined as provided in Section 13A-10-1. 

"(2) Offering a false instrument for recording against a public servant is a Class C felony.

"(e) If a false instrument has been filed against a public servant, the request to remove the false instrument may be transferred to circuit court and the proceeding may be expedited. If the request cannot be heard in circuit court within 45 days, the request may be heard by a magistrate. The Alabama Rules of Civil Procedure shall apply to any proceedings heard pursuant to this subsection."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
