The crime of home invasion would be a 14 Class A felony which would not be subject to 15 probation, parole, or a suspended sentence. Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 16 17 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the 18 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 19 Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 20 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a 21 new or increased expenditure of local funds from 22 becoming effective with regard to a local 23 governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote 24 unless: it comes within one of a number of 25 specified exceptions; it is approved by the

affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

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1 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 2 the entity for the purpose. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 3 4 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 5 the bill does not require approval of a local 6 7 governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the 8 9 specified exceptions contained in the amendment. 10 11 A BTTT 12 TO BE ENTITLED 13 AN ACT 14 To establish the crime of home invasion; to provide 15 criminal penalties; and in connection therewith would have as 16 17 its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 18 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as 19 Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the 20 21 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. 22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. This act shall be known as The Alabama 23 24 Home Invasion Act of 2012. 25 Section 2. (a) Home invasion is the unauthorized 26 entering, either by force, with or without a weapon, or by 27 coercion or subterfuge to gain entry, of any occupied dwelling

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with the intent to use force or violence upon another person,
to commit a theft therein, or to vandalize, deface, or damage
the property of the other person.

4 (b) This section does not apply to a law enforcement 5 officer acting within the line and scope of official duties.

6 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of 7 home invasion. Home invasion is a Class A felony which shall 8 not be subject to probation, parole, or a suspended sentence.

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its 9 10 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 11 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 12 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 13 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 14 15 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 16 existing crime.

17 Section 4. This act shall become effective on the 18 first day of the third month following its passage and 19 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
