24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 28-3A-20.1 is added to the Code
26	of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the 2 contrary, a person holding a license to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises may permit 3 a customer to remove one unsealed bottle of wine for consumption off the premises if the customer has purchased and 5 consumed a portion of the bottle of wine on the licensed 6 7 premises. The licensee or the licensee's agent shall either: (1) recork the bottle of wine with the original or similar 8 type cork that is reinserted in the bottle and the cork can 9 10 only be removed by a corkscrew or similar device; or (2) 11 securely reseal the bottle in a bag designed so that it is 12 visibly apparent that the resealed bottle of wine has not been 13 tampered with and shall provide a dated receipt for the 14 resealed bottle of wine to the customer. A wine bottle 15 recorked or resealed pursuant to the requirements of this section is otherwise subject to the requirements of Section 16 17 32-5A-330, but a bottle of wine complying with this section shall not be considered open. 18 19 Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed. 20 21 Section 3. This act shall become effective

immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
