"To qualify for the insurance premium reduction described in Section 27-13-120, the motor vehicle accident prevention course shall be sponsored by the National Safety Council, the American Automobile Association, or the American Association of Retired Persons AARP or shall be an equivalent program course approved by the Department of Public Safety. The program course shall consist of not less than eight six classroom or online hours of instruction, the instructors for the program course shall be certified by the sponsoring entity, and the contents of the course shall be outlined by the sponsoring entity."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
