15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. The following amendment to the
17	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and
18	shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a
19	majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in
20	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution
21	of Alabama of 1901, as amended:
22	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
23	Auburn University shall be under the management and
24	control of a board of trustees. Commencing on the day this
25	amendment is ratified, the board of trustees shall consist of
26	fifteen members as follows: one member from each of seven

districts as set forth herein, an additional member from Lee

County, the immediate past president of the Auburn Alumni

Association, five at-large members and the governor, who shall

be ex officio president of the board. One more than half of

the members then in office of the board shall constitute a

quorum, but a smaller number may adjourn from day to day until

a quorum is present.

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The respective districts shall be comprised of the following Alabama counties: District 1 -- Baldwin, Clarke, Escambia, Mobile, Monroe, and Washington; District 2 --Barbour, Bullock, Butler, Coffee, Conecuh, Covington, Crenshaw, Dale, Geneva, Henry, Houston, Montgomery, and Pike; District 3 -- Calhoun, Cherokee, Chambers, Clay, Cleburne, Lee, Macon, Randolph, Russell, St. Clair, Talladega, and Tallapoosa; District 4 -- Blount, Colbert, Cullman, DeKalb, Etowah, Fayette, Franklin, Lamar, Lawrence, Marion, Marshall, Walker and Winston; District 5 -- Jackson, Lauderdale, Limestone, Madison and Morgan; District 6 -- Autauga, Bibb, Chilton, Coosa, Elmore and Shelby; District 7 -- Choctaw, Dallas, Greene, Hale, Jefferson, Lowndes, Marengo, Perry, Pickens, Tuscaloosa, Sumter and Wilcox. The at-large members shall hold At-Large Position 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5. A majority of the board shall elect a president pro tempore of the board.

Appointment of members, including members to fill a vacated position with a partially expired term of office, shall be by the appointing committee created herein, by and

with the advice and consent of the Senate. A board of trustees 1 2 appointing committee is established composed of the following members: The President Pro Tempore of the Board of Trustees of 3 4 Auburn University or the designee of the President Pro 5 Tempore, who shall be a member of the Board of Trustees of 6 Auburn University; a member of the Board of Trustees of Auburn 7 University selected by the Board of Trustees; two members of the Auburn Alumni Association Board of Directors who are not 8 9 current employees of Auburn University, selected by the Auburn 10 Alumni Association Board of Directors; the Governor or a 11 designee of the Governor who is an alumnus of Auburn 12 University, but who is not a current member of the Board nor a 13 current member of the Auburn Alumni Association Board of Directors nor a current employee of Auburn University. The 14 15 Governor, or the designee of the Governor, shall serve as chairperson of the appointing committee. If the chairperson 16 17 fails to call a meeting within 90 days prior to the expiration 18 of the term of a sitting board member or within 30 days following the creation of a vacancy by death, resignation, or 19 20 other cause, a majority of the committee, in writing, may call 21 a meeting giving at least 10 days notice. In the absence of 22 the chairperson or another member designated by the 23 chairperson to preside, the majority of the committee shall 24 choose its own chairperson. The appointing committee as a 25 whole shall establish a procedure and timetable for soliciting 26 and selecting candidates for appointment prior to calling a

meeting. The committee shall ensure that appointments are solicited from all constituencies, are inclusive, and reflect the racial, gender, and economic diversity of the state or the continental United States, as applicable. A person may not be appointed to the Board of Trustees of Auburn University while serving on the appointing committee.

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For purposes of transitioning from the districts established by Amendment 670 to the new districts established herein and creating a permanent and uniform system of staggered terms for members of the Board of Trustees of Auburn University, on the day this amendment is ratified, the following realignment and modification of the positions and terms of office of trustees serving on that date will take place in the following manner: New District 1, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2020, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 1; new District 2, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2019, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 3; new District 3, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2014, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 5; new District 4, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2020, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 7; new District 5, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2016, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 8; new District 6, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2022, shall be filled by the incumbent in

former District 4; new District 7, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2022, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 9; Lee County, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2019, shall be filled by the incumbent in District 3/Lee County; At-Large Position 1, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2014, shall be filled by the successor to the four year at-large seat created under Amendment 670; At-Large Position 2, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2016, shall be filled by the successor to the seven year at-large seat created under Amendment 670; At-Large Position 3, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2021, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 2; At-Large Position 4, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2019, shall be filled by the incumbent in the at-large position formerly held by the state superintendent of education and converted to an at-large seat by Amendment 670; and At-Large Position 5, the term for which shall end at midnight on June 30, 2021, shall be filled by the incumbent in former District 6. If there is no incumbent sitting in a former position on the day this amendment is ratified, the new position shall be considered vacant and a person shall be appointed by the appointing committee to fill the position pursuant to the procedure provided for other appointments made by the appointing committee for the term provided herein. Any reference in this

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paragraph to incumbent shall mean the incumbent on the day this amendment is ratified.

To the extent the realignment of positions set forth above results in one or more incumbent trustees being designated to occupy a district position to which they would not be eligible for appointment under the requirements for appointment established herein, such trustee may nevertheless occupy that position for the term herein established. After the expiration of the term of any incumbent serving in the newly established districts, the successor, whether it be the incumbent or a new member, must meet the district requirements at the time of appointment.

Except for the initial terms after this amendment is ratified, the term of office for any district, the Lee County or any at-large position shall be seven years; provided, however, that no person shall be appointed as a member of the board of trustees after having reached 70 years of age. No person shall serve more than two full seven-year terms of office or more than 20 years total recognizing any time served before or after ratification of this amendment. Service for the remainder of an unexpired term shall not be considered in applying the two-term limit. A member may continue to serve until a successor is confirmed, but in no case for more than one year after completion of a term; however, any such extended time served shall decrease what would otherwise be a seven year term of the successor.

No trustee shall receive any pay or emolument other than his or her actual expenses incurred in the discharge of duties as such. No employees of Auburn University shall be eligible to serve as a member of the Board of Trustees.

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The appointing committee chairperson shall submit the name of the person selected for appointment to the Secretary of the Senate, who shall inform the Senate of the receipt of such submission. If the Senate is in regular session at that time, the submission shall be made by the conclusion of the next legislative day following the appointment. If the Senate is not in regular session at the time of the appointment, the submission shall be made before the commencement of the next regular session. If the entire Senate, by a majority vote, confirms the submission, the appointee shall immediately assume office. An appointee may not begin service prior to Senate confirmation. If the submission is not confirmed by the entire Senate by a majority vote by the conclusion of the legislative session, the submission shall be considered rejected. A submission to the Senate may be withdrawn at any time by the appointing committee chairperson in regard to appointments made by the committee. Upon the rejection of a submission or the withdrawal of a submission, the appointment and confirmation process specified in this amendment shall commence anew. The same name may not be submitted to the Senate for the same position on the board more than one time by the same

nominating committee. Upon the expiration of a term of office, a member of the Board of Trustees shall continue to serve until a successor appointed pursuant to this amendment is confirmed by the entire Senate by majority vote and assumes office. If a successor is not confirmed by the conclusion of the regular session in which one or more names for the position were initially submitted, the former holder of the position may continue to serve until a successor is appointed and confirmed, but in no case shall this continuation be longer than one year after completion of the term of office. If any position on the Board of Trustees becomes vacant during a term of office by reason of death, resignation or other cause, a person shall be appointed by the appointing committee to fill the remainder of the unexpired term of office pursuant to the procedure provided for other appointments made by the appointing committee. The position shall be considered vacant until a person is confirmed by a majority vote of the entire Senate. Any appointments confirmed after the ratification of this amendment shall be for the new districts established herein. Upon the ratification of this Amendment, Amendment 670 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 is hereby repealed. Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment

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Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this
