(a) Whenever the state, a county, a 18 municipality, or any other governmental entity is considering 19 the purchase of real property, the property shall first be 20

appraised by a certified general real property appraiser as defined in Section 34-27A-9(a)(5) of the Code of Alabama 1975. The owner or his or her designated representative shall be given an opportunity to accompany the appraiser during his or her inspection of the property.

(b) The appraisal and any documents related theretoshall initially be released only to the governmental entity

considering the purchase of real property. The appraisal and
 any documents related thereto shall not be deemed public
 records nor shall the documents be released by any party
 having access to them until one of the following has occurred:

5 (1) A final offer has been made and accepted for the 6 purchase of the property for an amount equal to or less than 7 the fair market value of the property as determined pursuant 8 to subsection (a).

9 (2) The governmental entity has decided to make an 10 offer for the purchase of the property at an amount higher 11 than the fair market value of the property as determined 12 pursuant to subsection (a) in the manner prescribed by this 13 act.

14 (3) The governmental entity has decided that the
15 purchase of the property is not in the best interest of the
16 governmental entity and the citizens it serves.

17 (c) If a governmental entity decides to purchase the property at issue for an amount which exceeds the fair market 18 value as determined pursuant to subsection (a), it shall only 19 do so by a recorded vote held at a regularly scheduled meeting 20 21 or at a specially called meeting held following at least three 22 days' notice. No vote on the purchase of property pursuant to 23 this subsection may be held unless the fair market value 24 established by the appraisal conducted pursuant to this act is 25 posted at least three days prior to the vote, the fair market 26 value has been included in the notice of the meeting, and a 27 public hearing has been held.

1 (d) If, following the completion of an appraisal, 2 the governmental entity attempts to pursue acquisition of the 3 property via condemnation or eminent domain, the appraisal 4 shall immediately become public record and be provided to the 5 owner of the property at issue.

6 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, 7 including the requirements of subsection (c), a governmental 8 entity shall be entitled to purchase property for an amount 9 equal to the fair market value determined pursuant to 10 subsection (a) plus an amount equal to the additional cost 11 which would have been required to acquire the property by 12 means of eminent domain or condemnation.

(f) Notwithstanding any provision set forth above, any appraisal conducted pursuant to this act shall become a public record 30 days following the completion of acquisition or the termination of negotiations for purchase of the property.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
