1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 41-9-708, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

"§41-9-708.

"(a) There is hereby created and established the
Alabama Indian Affairs Commission hereinafter called the
commission, which shall be administered under the direction
and supervision of the Joint Committee on Administrative
Regulations, as provided by Section 41-22-22.

10 "(b) The commission shall be composed of at least 11 11 12 members. All members of the commission must shall reside in Alabama. Members shall include a member of the State Senate, 12 13 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, and a member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the 14 15 House of Representatives, seven an Indian representatives 16 representative from the seven each of the tribes, bands, or 17 groups in the State of Alabama as specifically provided for in this section, and one member at large. The Governor shall 18 appoint seven Indian members from recommendations submitted by 19 20 each of the seven following Indian tribes, bands, or groups, 21 principally geographically located as follows: The Poarch Band 22 of Creeks of Escambia County, one member; the Mowa Band of 23 Choctaws of southwest Alabama, one member; the Star Clan of 24 Muscogee Creeks of Pike County, one member; the Echota 25 Cherokees of Alabama, one member; the Cherokees of northeast 26 Alabama, one member; the Cherokees of southeast Alabama, one

member; the Kawita Creeks of Russell County; and the Ma-Chis 1 2 Lower Creek Indian Tribe, one member. Each of the seven identified groups shall have one member. The commission shall 3 appoint one Alabama resident, who is a member of a federally 4 5 recognized Indian tribe, band or group, that is not a member 6 of any tribe represented on this commission. The Governor 7 shall appoint one member at large, who may be Indian or non-Indian; provided, however, that the majority of the 8 9 members of the commission shall always be Indian. All above 10 stated tribes, bands, and groups shall be state recognized 11 upon passage of this article. The commission shall have the 12 power to recognize additional Indian tribes, bands, or groups. 13 The commission shall adopt appropriate procedure for such the recognition process. Any recognized Indian tribe, band, or 14 15 group shall be entitled to have one representative on the 16 commission who shall be appointed for an initial term of three 17 years by the Governor and subject thereafter to the same 18 requirements and privileges as specified in subsections (b) and this subsection, subsection (c), and any other applicable 19 20 sections. Said The member shall be granted the same voting 21 powers accorded other members.

"(c) The commission shall elect a <u>chairman</u> <u>chair</u> of the commission from among its members. Members serving by virtue of their office within state government shall serve so long as they hold that office. The terms of office for all other members shall be for four years each, except for the

initial appointments which shall be as follows: Four members 1 2 for two years; two members for three years; and two members for four years. The initial term of office for persons who are 3 4 granted membership upon the recognition of their tribe, band, 5 or group by the commission shall be as provided in subsection 6 (b). The initial term and all subsequent terms of office of 7 the member representing the Ma-Chis Lower Creek Indian Tribe shall be four years. The initial term and all subsequent terms 8 9 of office of the member representing the Kawita Creeks shall 10 be four years. Each member shall serve until his or her successor is appointed. Members shall be eligible for 11 reappointment. Upon the death, disability, resignation, 12 13 removal, or refusal to serve of any member, the Governor shall 14 appoint a qualified member of that tribe, band, or group to 15 fill the unexpired term of office.

16 "(d) The chairman chair shall submit any written 17 complaint of any tribal body that appoints members to the 18 commission, or any written complaint of any other appointing authority that any commissioner is negligent in the 19 20 performance of his or her commission duties to the Governor 21 for review. After reviewing the complaint, if the Governor 22 determines the commission has been negligent, the Governor may 23 remove the commissioner from the commission and appoint a 24 successor as provided in this section."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
