1 "(a) Consent by a married woman to assisted
2 reproduction for herself must be in a record signed by the
3 woman and her husband and maintained by the assisting licensed
4 physician. Consent by the husband of a married woman is not
5 required for the donation of eggs by a married woman for
6 assisted reproduction by another woman.

7 "(b) Failure of the husband to sign a consent 8 required by subsection (a), before or after birth of the 9 child, does not preclude a finding that the husband is the 10 father of the child born to his wife if the wife and husband 11 openly held out the child as their own.

12 "(c) The consent of a spouse to assisted 13 reproduction may be withdrawn by that individual at anytime 14 <u>any time</u> before placement of the donated eggs, sperm, or 15 embryos. The withdrawal must be in a signed record maintained 16 by the licensed assisting physician.

"(d) Written consent by the husband of a married woman is required for the donation of eqqs by the woman for assisted reproduction by another woman. Written consent by the wife of a married man is required for the donation of sperm by the man for assisted reproduction of a woman who is not his wife. The written consent required by this subsection shall be obtained by the assisting licensed physician before donation."

24 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 25 first day of the third month following its passage and 26 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
