134697-2:n:02/09/2012:KMS/mcw LRS2011-5352R1 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 SYNOPSIS: This bill establishes the Flexible School 8 Calendar Act of 2012. 9 10 Under existing law, to receive the maximum 11 benefits from the Foundation Program Fund, local 12 boards of education are required to provide a 13 minimum school term of at least 180 days. This bill would require each local board of 14 education to establish a local calendar providing 15 180 full instructional days, or the hourly 16 17 equivalent thereof, per school year for the 18 computation of Foundation Program Fund benefits, 19 and would establish parameters for when academic 20 instruction may begin and end in the public 21 elementary and secondary schools of the state. 22 Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 23 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the 24 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 25 Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a 26 27 new or increased expenditure of local funds from

becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

8 The purpose or effect of this bill would be 9 to require a new or increased expenditure of local 10 funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 11 the bill does not require approval of a local 12 governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to 13 become effective because it comes within one of the 14 specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

> A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

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To establish the Flexible School Calendar Act of 20 21 2012; to amend Section 16-13-231, Code of Alabama 1975, as 22 amended by Act 2011-235, 2011 Regular Session (Acts 2011, p. 23 **), relating to the public education Foundation Program Fund; 24 to require each local board of education to establish a local 25 calendar providing 180 full instructional days, or the hourly 26 equivalent thereof, per school year for the computation of 27 Foundation Program Fund benefits; to establish parameters for

1 when academic instruction for students may begin and end in 2 the public elementary and secondary schools of the state; and in connection therewith to have as its purpose or effect the 3 4 requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or 5 6 effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 7 local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 8 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 9 10 Alabama of 1901, as amended.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be citedas the Flexible School Calendar Act of 2012.

Section 2. Section 16-13-231 of the Code of Alabama 15 1975, as amended by Act 2011-235, 2011 Regular Session (Acts 2011, p. **), is amended to read as follows:

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"§16-13-231.

"(a) In addition to all other appropriations and 18 apportionments of public school money now provided by law and 19 made available for public schools there shall be apportioned 20 21 and paid to local boards of education from the Foundation 22 Program Fund, the amounts to be determined as hereinafter 23 provided and in accordance with regulations of the State Board 24 of Education. This Foundation Program Fund shall be used 25 principally:

"(1) To aid in providing at least a 180 full
instructional day minimum school term, <u>or the hourly</u>

<u>equivalent thereof</u>, except as otherwise provided in paragraph
 c. of subdivision (1) of subsection (b); and,

3 "(2) To assist in the promotion of educational
4 opportunity for all children in the public schools.

5 "(b) The following requirements and procedures,
6 supplemented when necessary by regulations of the State Board
7 of Education, shall govern the apportionment of the fund:

8 "(1) REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATING IN FUND. In 9 order for a local board of education to share in the 10 apportionment of the Foundation Program Fund and to receive 11 the maximum benefits therefrom, the board shall meet the 12 following conditions:

13 "a. The appropriate local governing body must insure 14 that the local board of education within its jurisdiction is receiving an amount of local tax receipts equivalent to ten 15 mills of school tax as computed from the most current assessed 16 17 valuation of property which comprises the school tax district or districts of the local board of education. The State 18 Superintendent of Education shall determine compliance with 19 this provision of the law in accordance with rules or 20 21 procedures adopted by the State Board of Education. In 22 determining compliance for a county board of education, tax 23 revenues provided to the county board of education from the 24 county, from whatever tax source derived, shall be considered. 25 In determining compliance for a city board of education, tax 26 revenues provided to the city board of education by the county

and the city, from whatever tax source derived, shall be
 considered.

3 "b. In the expenditure of all funds available for 4 the Foundation Program as herein defined, the local board of 5 education shall as nearly as practicable provide the same 6 length of term in all schools.

7 "c. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, the local board of education shall provide a school 8 9 term of at least 180 full instructional days, or the hourly 10 equivalent thereof, beginning with school year 2006-2007 2012-2013, or such part of that school term as can be 11 12 maintained by using funds available and as defined by 13 regulations of the State Board of Education. The local 14 academic school calendar shall be annually established by the local board of education, within the parameters of 15 16 subparagraph 3. In case the local board of education fails to 17 operate any schools the minimum 180 full instructional day term, or the hourly equivalent thereof, or the minimum term as 18 defined by the State Board of Education, the Foundation 19 Program allowances of the local board of education shall be 20 21 computed only for the actual period the schools are in session 22 that school year.

"2. In extreme circumstances involving natural
occurrences, health-related occurrences, or other extenuating
circumstances that result in the cancellation of an
instructional day, a local board of education may submit a
plan for the approval of the State Superintendent of Education

1 to replace cancelled instructional days by adjusting the 2 school calendar to extend the hours of actual teaching time on specified instructional days. At any time the Governor 3 4 declares a state of emergency for any part of the state, any affected school system that is closed as a result and loses 5 student days or employee days, or both, may appeal to the 6 7 State Superintendent of Education for relief in fulfilling the local school calendar with respect to student days or employee 8 days, or both, with no loss of income to employees. 9

10 "3. Beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, a local board of education, in providing the minimum required 11 12 number of instructional days or hours, shall have greater 13 flexibility in establishing the school calendar by adjusting 14 the days or extending the hours of actual teaching or 15 instructional time provided on specified instructional days for the schools under the jurisdiction of the local board. The 16 17 academic school calendar, established by the local board of education, shall include the minimum required number of 18 instructional days or hours, with the first day of instruction 19 for students no earlier than the Monday two calendar weeks 20 21 before Labor Day, unless August 31 is a Monday, then on 22 Monday, August 17, and the last day of instruction for 23 students shall be no later than the Friday immediately before 24 Memorial Day.

25 "d. The local board of education shall expend funds 26 for teachers' salaries in accordance with a salary schedule 27 adopted by the local board of education and approved by the State Superintendent of Education. The salary schedule shall
 be at least 100 percent of those salary amounts specified in
 the State Minimum Salary Schedule by cell.

4 "The local board of education shall allocate state and local Foundation Program funds to each school in an 5 6 equitable manner, based on the needs of the students and the 7 schools, as reflected in the current year's actual student populations, including at-risk students, students receiving 8 special education services, and students enrolled in 9 10 vocational/technical educational programs. The local board of education shall report annually to the State Board of 11 12 Education on how all state and local funds for public 13 education, including Foundation Program funds and capital 14 outlay funds, have been allocated to each of its schools or area vocational centers. 15

16 "e. The local board of education shall submit to the 17 State Superintendent of Education, under the regulations of 18 the State Board of Education, the following:

19 "1. A proposed building program which sets out in 20 detail the location of all present and proposed buildings; 21 which indicates proposed educational centers and grades to be 22 taught at these centers and which provides schools for all 23 children of the local board of education.

24 "2. Except for those city boards of education not
25 maintaining a transportation system, a proposed transportation
26 program showing the proposed routing of buses and the
27 condition of all roads to be used for transportation.

"3. A proposed professional development program
 which sets out in detail the professional development needs of
 employees of the local board of education.

4 "4. A proposed technology program which sets out in
5 detail the proposed expenditures of technology funds.

6 "5. A proposed program for the provision of services 7 to students with disabilities and gifted students in 8 compliance with applicable state and federal laws.

9 "6. A proposed program for the provision of 10 vocational educational services in compliance with applicable 11 state and federal laws.

12 "7. A proposed program for the provision of 13 educational services to at-risk students in compliance with 14 applicable state and federal laws. The proposed program for 15 at-risk students shall include the provision that all funds 16 allocated shall be spent for at-risk students.

17 "f. The local board of education shall meet such 18 other standards as may be set up by the State Board of 19 Education to promote improved educational opportunity and 20 provide better schools.

"(2) DETERMINING COST OF FOUNDATION PROGRAM. In
determining the cost of the Foundation Program, the
Legislature, based on the recommendation of the State Board of
Education, shall proceed to find the following allowable costs
for each local board of education: Teachers' salaries, fringe
benefits, classroom instructional support, and other current
expense. The rate per employee set by the Legislature for

teachers' retirement and employees' health insurance shall be in effect for the entire fiscal year and shall not be increased by the Teachers' Retirement System or the Public Education Employees' Health Insurance Board, except by further action of the Legislature.

"a. The Foundation Program allowance for salaries of 6 7 teachers shall be determined as follows: The number of teacher units allowed in Section 16-13-232 for each local board of 8 9 education shall be multiplied by the amount or amounts per 10 teacher unit, which amounts shall be based on the average 11 salaries for each major classification required by the 12 operation of the State Minimum Salary Schedule established by 13 the Legislature in the Education Trust Fund appropriation bill 14 and adopted by the State Board of Education. In recommending 15 to the Governor and the Legislature the State Minimum Salary 16 Schedule the State Board of Education shall give due 17 consideration to degree level, certification, and public education experience. Any teacher, including, but not limited 18 to, a vocational education teacher, currently under contract 19 in excess of 187 days shall not have the term or salary of his 20 21 or her contract reduced as a result of this article.

"b. The Foundation Program allowance for fringe benefits shall be determined by multiplying a uniform percentage times the amount of teachers' salaries allowed in paragraph a. above or by multiplying a fixed rate depending on the type of fringe benefit. The fringe benefits allowances shall include amounts for the employer's contribution for

teachers' retirement, health insurance, Social Security, 1 2 Medicare, unemployment compensation, personal leave, and sick leave. The fringe benefits allowance may include allowances 3 4 for other fringe benefits as may be approved by the State Legislature. The State Legislature shall seek the input and 5 6 advice of appropriate agencies and individuals in setting 7 allowances. The Teachers' Retirement System and the Public Education Employees' Health Insurance Board shall recommend to 8 the Legislature, on or before the first legislative day of 9 10 each regular session of the Legislature, the rate for the following fiscal year. The Legislature shall set the rate in 11 12 the annual appropriation bill.

"c. The Foundation Program allowance for classroom 13 14 instructional support shall be determined by multiplying a 15 uniform amount times the number of teacher units allowed in Section 16-13-232. The uniform amount shall include allowances 16 17 for library enhancement, classroom materials and supplies, professional development, and technology. The library 18 enhancement appropriation shall be for K-12 Public School 19 Library/Media Centers and is an absolute appropriation. Other 20 21 expenditures may include book binding, repair, CD Roms, 22 computer software, computer equipment, cataloging, 23 audio-visual materials, newspapers, magazines, recordings, and 24 video tapes. The uniform amount may include allowances for 25 other classroom instructional support as may be approved by 26 the State Board of Education. The Foundation Program allowance 27 for classroom instructional support shall also include an

1 allowance for textbooks which shall be determined on a per 2 pupil basis. The number of pupils shall be determined by the number of pupils in average daily membership during the first 3 4 20 scholastic days after Labor Day of the preceding school vear. The State Board of Education shall recommend to the 5 Governor the amount for each cost factor included in classroom 6 7 instructional support on or before December 1 of the current fiscal year for the ensuing fiscal year. 8

9 "d. The Foundation Program allowance for other 10 current expense shall be determined by multiplying a uniform 11 amount by the number of earned units. The uniform amount shall 12 be recommended by the State Board of Education to the Governor 13 on or before December 1 of the current fiscal year for the 14 ensuing fiscal year.

15 "e. The State Board of Education may cause, from 16 time to time, a study of allowances for teachers' salaries, 17 fringe benefits, classroom instructional support, and other 18 current expense of local boards of education to be conducted 19 and, based on the results of the study, may propose any 20 necessary changes to the Governor and Legislature.

"f. The total cost of the Foundation Program for any local board of education shall be the total allowed for teachers' salaries, for fringe benefits, for classroom instructional support, and for other current expense. The allowances herein to the local boards of education shall be expended subject to all applicable laws, rules, and regulations; however, the total funds calculated in the total

cost of the Foundation Program for teachers' salaries shall be
 expended for salaries within the instructional program.

3 "(3) DETERMINING FUNDS AVAILABLE TO PROVIDE4 FOUNDATION PROGRAM.

5 "a. The funds available to meet the cost of the 6 Foundation Program shall be appropriated by the Legislature 7 taking into consideration an amount of local effort required 8 on the part of each local board of education. The required 9 local effort charged against each local board of education for 10 its share of the cost of the Foundation Program shall be as 11 follows:

12 "1. For the 1995-96 fiscal year, the equivalent of 13 five mills of local school tax district ad valorem tax as 14 reported pursuant to subsection (b)(1)a.

15 "2. For the 1996-97 fiscal year, the equivalent of
16 seven and one-half mills of local school tax district ad
17 valorem tax as reported pursuant to subsection (b)(1)a.

18 "3. For the 1997-98 fiscal year, the equivalent of 19 ten mills of local school tax district ad valorem tax as 20 reported pursuant to subsection (b)(1)a.

"4. For each fiscal year thereafter, the equivalent of ten mills of local school tax district ad valorem tax as reported pursuant to subsection (b)(1)a.

24 "b. After calculating the total cost of the
25 Foundation Program for each local board of education, the
26 state allocation from the Education Trust Fund is calculated
27 by subtracting the local effort required by this section from

the total cost. Although the cost of the Foundation Program is calculated for each school, the one sum allocation for each local board of education shall flow monthly to the local board of education. The state funds for the Foundation Program shall be allotted by the State Board of Education consistent with State Board of Education rules and regulations."

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill requires expenditures only by a school board.

14 Section 4. This act shall become effective on the 15 first day of the third month following its passage and 16 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
