TO BE ENTITLED

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1 AN ACT

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Relating to political action committees; to require each political action committee receiving funds from another political action committee for get-out-the-vote operations, voting rights advocacy, and voter education to establish separate accounts apart from the accounts whose funds are expended to candidates; to require each political action committee to report its activity, separately, in accordance with current Fair Campaign Practice Act laws; to require all political action committees to pay an annual registration fee determined on a uniform basis by the Alabama Secretary of State in consultation with the Alabama Ethics Commission; to provide that all funds received from the fee by the Secretary of State would be transferred to the Alabama Ethics Commission for funding a monitoring division within the Alabama Ethics Commission; to provide that each political action committee which fails to file in a timely or compliant manner would be subject to a civil penalty; to require the Ethics Commission to report each failure to file a report that it deemed intentional; to require the Ethics Commission to report a third failure to file to the Attorney General for criminal action; to require the Alabama Ethics Commission to establish a new division within the commission to monitor each registered candidate and political action committee in accordance with the Fair Campaign Practice Act and to provide for its duties; and to require each candidate and campaign

committee to designate an individual, or registered agent, and to provide for his or her duties and responsibilities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. A political action committee receiving funds from another political action committee to aid get-out-the-vote operations, voting rights advocacy, or voter education shall establish separate accounts so that no money transferred from one political action committee to another can be comingled with funds that are expended to candidates. Each account shall report its activity in accordance with the Fair Campaign Practice Act. Each account shall report separately.

Section 2. (a) On or after January 1, 2013, each political action committee and each candidate shall pay an annual registration fee to be determined by the Alabama Secretary of State in consultation with the Alabama Ethics Commission. These funds shall be earmarked for funding a monitoring division within the Alabama Ethics Commission.

(b) Failure to file in a timely or compliant manner shall result in a penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the first offense. If a second offense occurs, regardless of the election cycle in which the first offense occurred, a penalty of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) shall be imposed. Any first or second offense deemed intentional by the Ethics Commission shall be referred to the Attorney General for further criminal action. A third offense shall automatically be deemed intentional and referred to the Attorney General.

The funds from the fines shall be earmarked for the funding of a monitoring division within the Ethics Commission.

- (c) Beginning with the electronic filings for the 2014 election cycle, the Alabama Ethics Commission shall establish a division to monitor each registered candidate and political action committee in accordance with the Fair Campaign Practice Act. The division shall alert the Attorney General if any criminal action is deemed necessary.
- (d) Each candidate and campaign committee shall designate an individual, or registered agent, who shall be held legally responsible for ensuring that reports are accurate and in compliance with the Fair Campaign Practice Act. The candidate and registered agent shall be held responsible for any fines levied or criminal charges brought against the candidate or campaign committee. Fines may be paid out of campaign committee funds. The designation for a political action committee shall be made when paying the annual registration fee; campaign committees shall make the designation when paying the registration fee. If any changes are deemed necessary during that time, an additional change of registered agent fee may be imposed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
