4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, if a peace officer, firefighter, or volunteer firefighter is killed in the line of duty or dies as a result of an injury received in the line of duty, his or her surviving spouse and dependant children shall continue to be covered under the State Employees' Health Insurance Board (SEHIB) plan and the cost shall be paid from the State Treasury.

(b) The coverage shall cease for the spouse if he or she remarries or obtains an alternate health insurance provider. Coverage shall cease for any dependant when his or her eligibility for coverage terminates.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
