4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The presiding judge of each judicial 5 6 circuit may authorize pretrial motion hearings in civil 7 matters in the circuit courts and probate courts to be conducted by telephone conferencing or other audio-video 8 telecommunications means. The presiding judge shall develop 9 10 and publish procedures for the conduct of the civil hearings 11 in the circuit courts and probate courts in his or her 12 judicial circuit.

(b) The telephone or audio-video telecommunications
device used in the hearing shall enable the judge and all
parties to converse simultaneously with each other.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on January 1 of the year following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
