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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 24-1-28, Code of Alabama 1975, is
amended to read as follows:

4 "\$24-1-28.

"(a) The authority shall have the right to acquire 5 by eminent domain any property, real or personal, which it may 6 7 deem necessary to carry out the purposes of this article, after the adoption by it of a resolution declaring that the 8 acquisition of the property described therein is in the public 9 10 interest and necessary for public use. The authority may exercise the power of eminent domain pursuant to the 11 12 provisions of Title 18. Property already devoted to a public 13 use may be acquired; provided, that no property belonging to 14 any city within the boundaries of the authority, or to any 15 government, may be acquired without its consent, and that no property belonging to a public utility corporation may be 16 17 acquired without the approval of the Public Service Commission or other body having regulatory power over such corporation. 18

"(b) In Class 3 municipalities, except a Class 3 19 municipality organized under Act 618 of the 1973 Regular 20 21 Session, the authority may purchase real property only after 22 notice of intent to purchase the property is given to 23 surrounding property owners. Notice of the proposed purchase 24 in such Class 3 municipalities shall be sent via first class 25 mail to each residential and business address within 500 yards 26 of the property proposed to be purchased not less than 30 days 1 prior to execution of any binding agreement to purchase the 2 property."

3 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
