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22	To amend Section 13A-5-13, Code of Alabama 1975,
23	relating to hate crimes; to impose additional penalties for
24	the crimes of arson, burglary, or criminal mischief in any
25	degree when committed against religious property.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 13A-5-13, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 "\$13A-5-13.

- 4 "(a) The Legislature finds and declares the following:
  - "(1) It is the right of every person, regardless of race, color, religion, national origin, ethnicity, or physical or mental disability, to be secure and protected from threats of reasonable fear, intimidation, harassment, and physical harm caused by activities of groups and individuals.
  - "(2) It is not the intent, by enactment of this section, to interfere with the exercise of rights protected by the Constitution of the State of Alabama or the United States.
  - "(3) The intentional advocacy of unlawful acts by groups or individuals against other persons or groups and bodily injury or death to persons is not constitutionally protected when violence or civil disorder is imminent, and poses a threat to public order and safety, and such conduct should be subjected to criminal sanctions.
  - "(b) The purpose of this section is to impose additional penalties where it is shown that a perpetrator committing the underlying offense was motivated by the victim's actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, ethnicity, or physical or mental disability.
  - "(c) A person who has been found guilty of a crime, the commission of which was shown beyond a reasonable doubt to have been motivated by the victim's actual or perceived race,

color, religion, national origin, ethnicity, or physical or mental disability, shall be punished as follows:

## "(1) Felonies:

"a. On conviction of a Class A felony that was found to have been motivated by the victim's actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, ethnicity, or physical or mental disability, the sentence shall not be less than 15 years.

"b. On conviction of a Class B felony that was found to have been motivated by the victim's actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, ethnicity, or physical or mental disability, the sentence shall not be less than 10 years.

"c. On conviction of a Class C felony that was found to have been motivated by the victim's actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, ethnicity, or physical or mental disability, the sentence shall not be less than two years.

"d. For purposes of this subdivision, a criminal defendant who has been previously convicted of any felony and receives an enhanced sentence pursuant to this section is also subject to enhanced punishment under the Alabama Habitual Felony Offender Act, Section 13A-5-9.

## "(2) Misdemeanors:

"On conviction of a misdemeanor which was found beyond a reasonable doubt to have been motivated by the victim's actual or perceived race, color, religion, national

1	origin, ethnicity, or physical or mental disability, the
2	defendant shall be sentenced for a Class A misdemeanor, except
3	that the defendant shall be sentenced to a minimum of three
4	months.
5	"(d) Any person who commits any of the following
6	offenses against religious property, and because of the
7	religious character of that property, shall be subject to the
8	additional penalties under subsection (c):
9	"(1) Arson in the first degree pursuant to Section
10	13A-7-41, arson in the second degree pursuant to Section
11	13A-7-42, and arson in the third degree pursuant to Section
12	<u>13A-7-43.</u>
13	"(2) Burglary in the first degree pursuant to
14	Section 13A-7-5, burglary in the second degree pursuant to
15	Section 13A-7-6, and burglary in the third degree pursuant to
16	Section 13A-7-7.
17	"(3) Criminal mischief in the first degree pursuant
18	to Section 13A-7-21, criminal mischief in the second degree
19	pursuant to Section 13A-7-22, and criminal mischief in the
20	third degree pursuant to Section 13A-7-23.
21	"(e) For the purposes of this section, religious
22	property means any church, religious cemetery, or other place
23	of religious worship, including fixtures or religious objects
24	contained within a place of religious worship."
25	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
26	first day of the third month following its passage and
27	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
