Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the study commission. Beginning with the 2012 Regular Session, the study commission shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature biennially not later than the fifth legislative day of the regular session.

entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the study commission. Upon requisitions signed by the chair of the study commission, these payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the Comptroller on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state business. The total expenditures of the study commission shall not exceed \$5,000.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
