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3	To amend Section 16-13-232, Code of Alabama 1975, as
4	last amended by Act 2010-556, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 2010,

7	combine fractional teacher units to make a whole unit; to
8	allow the local superintendent of education, with approval of
9	the local board of education, to assign those teacher units;
10	and to allow the local board of education to use any funds
11	from uncombined fractional teacher units for salaries and
12	benefits.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 16-13-232 of the Code of Alabama
15	1975, as last amended by Act 2010-556, 2010 Regular Session
16	(Acts 2010, p. 1129), is amended to read as follows:
17	"§16-13-232.
18	"(a) In determining the number of teacher units for
19	the purpose of apportioning the state Foundation Program, one
20	teacher unit or fraction thereof shall be allowed for the
21	specified number of pupils in average daily membership as
22	provided for in subsection (b), during the first 20 scholastic
23	days following Labor Day of the preceding school year in the
24	public schools. In extreme circumstances involving natural
25	occurrences, health-related occurrences, or other extenuating
26	circumstances as determined and approved by the State
27	Superintendent of Education, average daily membership for

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1 local boards of education may be calculated using alternative 2 days to the first 20 scholastic days following Labor Day. Such alternative calculation shall be determined by the State 3 4 Department of Education on a case by case basis. If a request from a local board is made to the State Superintendent, the 5 6 superintendent shall submit a report detailing the decision of 7 the superintendent to the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation-Education and the House Education Appropriations 8 9 Committees and to the Department of Examiners of Public 10 Accounts within 30 days following the end of the average daily membership reporting period. Average daily membership is 11 12 defined as the average number of students enrolled on a daily 13 basis. Each school, at a minimum, shall earn instructional 14 support units based on the accreditation standards of the commissions which comprise the Southern Association of 15 Colleges and Schools or as otherwise required by an 16 17 accreditation system adopted by the State Board of Education. Instructional support units shall be earned for principals, 18 assistant principals, counselors, and librarians, and shall be 19 added to a school's teacher units to determine total units 20 21 earned for each school. Notwithstanding the accreditation 22 standards referenced above, every school shall earn one 23 full-time principal unit beginning with the fiscal year 24 2008-2009. An instructional support unit earned for a 25 principal shall be increased by a factor of .7 for high 26 schools, unit schools, and area vocational centers; .6 for middle schools; and .5 for elementary schools. An 27

1 instructional support unit earned for an assistant principal 2 shall be increased by .3; and an instructional support unit earned for a high school guidance counselor shall be increased 3 4 by .1. Each area vocational center shall earn only one instructional support unit which shall be a principal 5 (director) and shall continue to earn a counselor should it 6 7 have received a counselor unit in 1994-95. Beginning in the 2009-10 school year, the salary supplement factors for 8 instructional support units, including principals, assistant 9 10 principals, counselors, and librarians, shall be recommended to the Governor and the Legislature annually by the State 11 12 Board of Education, but shall not be less than the factors established above. Those local boards of education which show 13 14 an increase in average daily membership during the first 20 15 scholastic days following Labor Day of the current year may be allowed one additional teacher unit or fraction thereof for 16 17 each specified number of pupils in subsection (b) in such increase in average daily membership for such current year. 18 Fractional teacher units may be combined to create whole 19 units. Assignment of whole and fractional teacher units shall 20 21 be made by the local superintendent of education and submitted 22 for approval of the local board of education. Any funds remaining from a fractional teacher unit that are not combined 23 with and used to make a whole teacher unit may be used by the 24 local board of education for salaries and benefits. 25 26 "(b) The grade level divisors for each fiscal year

27 shall be weighted for each grade to provide funding for

1 special education and vocational education. For the 1995-96 2 school year the grade level divisors include for special education 5 percent full time equivalent across all grades 3 4 weighted 2.5 times the regular student weight. For the 1995-96 school year the grade level divisors include for 5 vocational/technical education 7.4 percent full time 6 7 equivalent in grades 7-8 weighted 1.4 times the regular student weight, and 16.5 percent full time equivalent in 8 grades 9-12 weighted 2.0 times the regular student weight. The 9 10 weights for special education and vocational education shall 11 be recommended to the Governor and the Legislature annually by 12 the State Board of Education. For the 1995-1996 school year, one teacher unit shall be allowed for each 16 pupils in 13 14 average daily membership in kindergarten through third grade; 15 one teacher unit shall be allowed for each 24 pupils in average daily membership in grade four through grade six; one 16 17 teacher unit shall be allowed for each 23 pupils in average daily membership in grade seven through grade eight; and one 18 teacher unit shall be allowed for each 20 pupils in average 19 daily membership in grade nine through grade twelve. Beginning 20 21 in the 1996-97 school year, the teacher unit divisors shall be 22 recommended to the Governor and the Legislature annually by 23 the State Board of Education, but shall not be higher than the 24 divisors established for the 1995-1996 school year.

"(c) It is the intent of the Legislature that local
boards of education experiencing increases in average daily
membership receive payment for additional current teacher

1 units earned pursuant to subsection (a) as early in the school 2 year as possible. The State Superintendent of Education shall certify to the State Budget Officer the amount for additional 3 4 current teacher units earned and/or other current expense increase required by subsection (j) and shall adjust the local 5 6 board of education's regular allocation of state funds, and 7 make requisition on the state Comptroller accordingly, within thirty days of receipt of the first 20 scholastic days 8 9 membership report.

10 "(d) Current units shall be calculated by comparing the first 20 scholastic days following Labor Day of average 11 12 daily membership of a current year with that of the prior 13 year. This comparison shall be grade by grade with the prior 14 year first 20 scholastic days following Labor Day average 15 daily membership subtracted from the current year first 20 scholastic days following Labor Day average daily membership. 16 17 The difference shall be divided by the Foundation Program grade divisor for each grade. The result by grade shall be 18 summed over all grades to yield current teacher units by local 19 board of education. No current teacher units shall be earned 20 21 if the number of units by local board of education is less than or equal to zero. The total of all current teacher units 22 23 by local board of education determines the number of state 24 current teacher units for the year.

"(e) The allocation of funds for current teacherunits shall be determined by multiplying the average

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allocation per teacher unit in the current year Foundation
 Program.

3 "(f) Current teacher unit calculations shall be
4 completed by the State Department of Education not later than
5 December 1 of the current year and the allocation of current
6 teacher unit funds shall be distributed in accordance with
7 subsection (c).

8 "(g) If funds allocated for current teacher units 9 are insufficient to fully fund current teacher units, the 10 allocation for each current teacher unit shall be prorated 11 accordingly based upon funds available for that purpose.

"(h) The State Department of Education shall report
to the Governor by December 1 of each year the estimated
current teacher units for the next budget year.

15 "(i) Current teacher units shall be allocated only 16 when earned.

17 "(j) Current teacher unit funds not earned shall be 18 distributed to all local boards of education as an increase in 19 other current expense.

20 "(k) Local boards of education have the management 21 responsibility to allocate current teacher unit funds where 22 needed."

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective
24 immediately following its passage and approval by the
25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
