1	Section 1. Sections 14-6-1 and 36-22-3, Code of
2	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
3	"§14-6-1.
4	"The sheriff has the legal custody and charge of the
5	jail in his <u>or her</u> county and all prisoners committed thereto,
6	except in cases otherwise provided by law, and. The sheriff
7	may appoint a jailer <u>employ persons to carry out the duties of</u>
8	the sheriff related to the operation of the jail and
9	supervision of inmates housed therein for whose acts he or she
10	is civilly responsible. The persons employed by the sheriff
11	shall be acting for and under the direction and supervision of
12	the sheriff and shall be entitled to the same immunities and
13	legal protections granted to the sheriff under the general
14	laws and the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.
15	"§36-22-3.
16	" <u>(a)</u> It shall be the duty of the sheriff:
17	"(1) To execute and return the process and orders of
18	the courts of record of this state and of officers of
19	competent authority with due diligence when delivered to him
20	or her for that purpose, according to law.
21	"(2) To attend upon the circuit courts and district
22	courts held in his <u>or her</u> county when in session and the
23	courts of probate, when required by the judge of probate, and
24	to obey the lawful orders and directions of such courts.
25	(3) The sheriff of each county must <u>To</u> , three days
26	before each session of the circuit court in his <u>or her</u> county,
27	render to the county treasury or custodian of county funds a

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statement in writing and on oath of the moneys received by him <u>or her</u> for the county, specifying the amount received in each case, from whom and pay the amount to the county treasurer or custodian of county funds.

5 (4) It shall be the duty of sheriffs in their 6 respective counties, by themselves or <u>To, with the assistance</u> 7 <u>of</u> deputies <u>as necessary</u>, to ferret out crime, to apprehend 8 and arrest criminals and, insofar as within their power, to 9 secure evidence of crimes in their counties and to present a 10 report of the evidence so secured to the district attorney or 11 assistant district attorney for the county.

12 (5) To perform such other duties as are or may be13 imposed by law.

14 "(b) Any of the duties of the sheriff set out in subsection (a) or as otherwise provided by law may be carried 15 out by deputies, jailers, corrections officers, or other 16 employees or agents of the sheriff as determined appropriate 17 by the sheriff in accordance with state law. A person 18 undertaking any duties for and under the direction and 19 supervision of the sheriff shall be entitled to the same 20 21 immunities and legal protections granted to the sheriff under 22 the general laws and the Constitution of Alabama of 1901." Section 2. This act shall become effective 23 24 immediately following its passage and approval by the 25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
