To allow the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sunday for on-premises and off-premises consumption by a retail business located in the portion of a state park within the corporate limits of a municipality where the sale of alcoholic beverages is permitted, subject to a municipal referendum approval.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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9 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited 10 as the State Park Environmental Protection and Promotion 11 (STEPP) Act .

12 Section 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law, and 13 subject to referendum approval as provided in this act, 14 alcoholic beverages may be sold on Sunday by properly licensed 15 retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board located in the portion of a state park within the corporate 16 17 limits of a municipality where the sale of alcoholic beverages is permitted for on-premises and off-premises consumption. 18 Alcoholic beverages shall be sold on Sunday only between the 19 hours of 1:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. No licensee under the 20 21 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board designated as a lounge shall 22 be permitted to serve alcoholic beverages on Sunday. All other 23 licensees may operate under this act.

24 Section 3. The governing body of each municipality 25 shall hold a referendum to determine if alcoholic beverages 26 may be sold for on-premises and off-premises consumption by a

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retail business located within the portion of a state park
within its limits.

Section 4. A referendum shall be held at a special 3 4 election called for that purpose by the municipal governing body after a petition of support signed by 500 residents of 5 6 the municipality. The petition shall be signed by each 7 resident with his or her address and phone number listed therein. The petition shall be presented to the mayor and 8 council of the municipality with a request to hold the 9 10 referendum on this act. At this point and only at this point may the referendum be held. Costs of the referendum shall be 11 12 paid by the municipality. A second or subsequent referendum 13 shall not be held within 12 months following a referendum 14 which fails to be approved by the voters of the municipality.

Section 5. All revenues created by the passage of 15 this bill shall be allocated by local act of the Legislature 16 17 provided that 25 percent of all revenues created shall be set aside in a fund for the promotion and advancement of the state 18 parks in the city limits of the municipality. This fund shall 19 be called the State Parks Protection and Development Trust 20 21 Fund. There shall be a board created and appointed by the 22 local legislative delegation to operate the trust fund. Until 23 the effective date of this act, the municipality in which the 24 park lies shall hold the tax collected pursuant to this bill 25 in trust.

Section 6. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
