17	PROPOSED AMENDMENT		
18	(a)(1) There is created a Legislative Compensation		
19	Commission. The commission shall consist of five members who		
20	shall be appointed as follows:		
21	a. Two members shall be appointed by the Governor.

23	Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court.		
24	c. One member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant

(2) The appointing authorities shall strive insofar as practicable to provide a balanced representation of the geographic, gender, racial, and ethnic diversity of the state. Members of the commission shall each be appointed on February 1, 2015, and quadrennially thereafter, to serve a term of four years. Within 30 days of a vacancy on the commission, the appointing authority for that position shall appoint a person to serve the unexpired portion of the term.

- (3) The Governor shall designate two members of the commission to serve as chair and vice chair, respectively.
- (4)a. An appointing authority may not appoint a person to the commission who is an official or employee of the State of Alabama or any department, agency, or political subdivision thereof, or an official or employee of any agency or institution where more than 10 percent of his or her gross annual income comes from state funds.
- b. The members may not receive compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed at the same rate of per diem as state employees for expenses incurred for performance of their official duties.
- (5) A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Any action taken by the commission shall be by a majority of the membership.
- (6) The commission shall set by resolution approved by a majority of the membership of the commission by the fifteenth legislative day of the fourth regular session of

each legislative quadrennium, the salary, expense allowance,
benefits, and other compensation for the members of the

Alabama Legislature. The resolution shall be effective on and
after the first day of the January succeeding the next general
election unless it is rejected by a joint resolution approved
by both houses of the Alabama Legislature, with a recorded

vote.

- (7) The commission shall have exclusive authority to modify legislative compensation. The Legislature may not modify legislative compensation or benefits.
- (8) The Alabama Personnel Department shall furnish, from existing resources, staff and services to the commission as needed for the performance of its duties.
- (b) Effective on the date of the adoption of the initial resolution by the commission pursuant to subdivision (6) subsection (a) of this amendment all laws or parts of laws in conflict with subsection (a) are repealed, including, but not limited to: Act 87-209, Act 91-108, Act 2007-75, Act 1196 of the 1971 Regular Session, Act 91-95, Act 90-490, Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, and Section 29-1-8, Code of Alabama 1975.
- (c) Effective on the date of the adoption of the initial resolution by the commission pursuant to subdivision (6) of subsection (a) of this amendment, those parts of Amendments 39 and 57 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, which are in conflict with subsection (a) are repealed.

An election upon the proposed amendment 2 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 3 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 5 6 state. 7 Section 3.
