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## 2 ENROLLED, An Act,

Relating to Jefferson County; to provide that, after the effective date of this act, persons in certain specified positions in county government shall be engaged and employed at-will, and shall serve at pleasure as unclassified employees not subject to the merit system otherwise applicable with respect to employees of the county generally; to authorize the determination of the compensation of such persons serving as unclassified employees; to provide that any unclassified employee shall, in respect of dismissal or for any other grievance, have no right of appeal to the Personnel Board of Jefferson County and no property interest in his or her position of employment as an unclassified employee of the county; to provide for and restrict in certain events the return of an unclassified employee to the county's classified service; to provide that a person's conversion from employment in the classified service of the county to an unclassified position shall be a condition of employment for appointment made after the effective date of such county employee to an unclassified position; to provide that persons not previously employees of the county at the time of their appointment to unclassified positions as provided for in the act shall become unclassified employees of the county; and to provide that persons employed as unclassified employees shall be eligible

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 5 Section 1. This act shall apply only to Jefferson 6 County.
- Section 2. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the

  contrary, persons holding any of the following positions in

  the employment of Jefferson County shall be employed at-will

  as unclassified employees and are not subject to the county

  merit system:
- 12 (1) Any attorney in the office of the county 13 attorney.

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- (2) The chief financial officer of the county.
- (3) County department and agency heads and their chief deputies.
- 17 (4) Any person employed in the county unclassified executive service.
  - (b) The Personnel Board of Jefferson County may designate or create positions in the county unclassified executive service upon recommendation or request of the county commission.
- (c) A person employed in an unclassified position listed in subdivisions (1) to (4), inclusive, of subsection (a) shall serve at the pleasure of the applicable appointing

authority, who shall set the rate of compensation of the unclassified employee, with the subsequent approval of a majority of the county commission at a commission meeting. A person employed in an unclassified position shall have no rights of appeal under the enabling act of the Personnel Board of Jefferson County, Act 248 of the Alabama Legislature of 1945, p. 376, as amended, and no property interest in an unclassified position.

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- (d) In the event that an employee in the classified service is appointed to and accepts an unclassified position listed in subdivisions (1) to (4), inclusive, of subsection (a), such employee may return to the classified service following any termination without cause from the unclassified appointment, at the same job classification from which such employee was appointed, provided that such a vacant position exists.
- (e) For purposes of subsection (d), "cause" includes any of the following reasons:
- (1) The employee was at the time of his or her appointment or has since become ineligible to be employed by the county because the employee failed to meet the minimum job-related qualifications for his or her position.

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- (4) Failure to perform his or her duties as provided by this act in an honorable, competent, and reasonably efficient manner.
  - (5) He or she becomes morally, physically, or mentally unfit to act on behalf of the county.
- (f) No person employed in the classified service as a department or agency head or chief deputy before the effective date of this act shall be converted to an unclassified employee described in subdivisions (1) to (4), inclusive, of subsection (a), unless the person voluntarily elects the conversion with the approval of the personnel board and the appointing authority. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a conversion to an unclassified employee status shall be a condition of employment for any appointment to an unclassified position listed in subdivisions (1) to (4), inclusive, of subsection (a) made on or after the effective date of this act. Any noncounty employee appointed to an unclassified position listed in subdivisions (1) to (4), inclusive, of subsection (a) on or after the effective date of this act, by virtue of the appointment, shall be an unclassified nonmerit system employee of Jefferson County.
- (g) A person employed in an unclassified position listed in subdivisions (1) to (4), inclusive, of subsection
