A person who has been convicted of 5 violating any felony provision of Chapter 17, Title 17, Code 6 of Alabama 1975, may not serve as an employee, officer or a 7 volunteer at any voter center, voting place, precinct, on a 8 canvassing board, on an election commission, or on a board of 9 registrars or in any other capacity as an election officer or 10 overseer of any election.

11 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 12 first day of the third month following its passage and 13 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
