This bill would delete both of these 19 20 provisions. 21 22 A BILL 23 TO BE ENTITLED 24 AN ACT 25 To amend Act 2010-564, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 26 27 2010, p. 1143), now appearing as Section 32-5A-171, Code of

Alabama 1975, relating to maximum speed limits; to delete the provision relating to the enforcement of speed limits on interstate highways by certain municipal law enforcement officers; and to delete the provision prohibiting municipal law enforcement officers from enforcing speed limits on interstate highways within the police jurisdiction of the municipality.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9 Section 1. Act 2010-564, 2010 Regular Session (Acts
10 2010, p. 1143), now appearing as Section 32-5A-171, Code of
11 Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§32-5A-171.

13 "Except when a special hazard exists that requires 14 lower speed for compliance with Section 32-5A-170, the limits 15 hereinafter specified or established as hereinafter authorized 16 shall be maximum lawful speeds, and no person shall drive a 17 vehicle at a speed in excess of the maximum limits.

18 "(1) No person shall operate a vehicle in excess of19 30 miles per hour in any urban district.

"(2) "(2)a. No person shall operate a motor vehicle in excess of 35 miles per hour on any unpaved road. For purposes of this chapter the term unpaved road shall mean any highway under the jurisdiction of any county, the surface of which consists of natural earth, mixed soil, stabilized soil, aggregate, crushed sea shells, or similar materials without the use of asphalt, cement, or similar binders. "b. No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any county-maintained paved road in an unincorporated area of the state at a speed in excess of 45 miles per hour unless a different maximum speed is established under authority granted in subdivision (6) or as provided in subdivision (7) subject to the maximum rate of speed provided in subdivision (3).

7 "(3) No person shall operate a motor vehicle on the 8 highways in this state, other than interstate highways or 9 highways having four or more traffic lanes, at a speed in 10 excess of 55 miles per hour at any time unless a different 11 maximum rate of speed is authorized by the Governor under 12 authority granted in subdivision (6) or as provided in 13 subdivision (7).

14 "(4) No person shall operate a motor vehicle, on an 15 interstate highway within the State of Alabama, at a speed in excess of 70 miles per hour or on any other highway having 16 17 four or more traffic lanes at a speed in excess of 65 miles per hour, unless a different maximum rate of speed is 18 authorized by the Governor under authority granted in 19 subdivision (6) or as provided in subdivision (7). 20 21 Notwithstanding the provisions of this subdivision, any portion of Corridor X/I-22 which is open between the 22 23 Alabama/Mississippi state line and the Jefferson County line 24 shall be considered an interstate highway for the purpose of 25 the maximum speed limit on the highway.

"(5) Notwithstanding any provisions of this section
to the contrary, no person shall operate a passenger vehicle,

1 motor truck, or passenger bus which carries or transports 2 explosives or flammable liquids, as defined in Section 32-1-1.1, or hazardous wastes, as defined in Section 3 4 22-30-3(5), in this state unless the vehicle, truck, or bus prominently displays a current decal, plate, or placard which 5 is required by the rules or regulations of the DOT or the PSC 6 7 which indicates or warns that the vehicle, truck, or bus is carrying or transporting the substances. No person shall 8 operate the vehicle, truck, or bus at a rate of speed greater 9 10 than 55 miles per hour at any time unless a different maximum 11 rate of speed is authorized by the Governor under authority granted in subdivision (6) or as provided in subdivision (7). 12

13 "(6) The Governor may prescribe the maximum rate of 14 speed whenever a different rate of speed is required by 15 federal law in order for Alabama to receive federal funds for 16 highway maintenance and construction.

"(7) The maximum speed limits set forth in this
section may be altered as authorized in Sections 32-5A-172 and
32-5A-173.

"(8) A law enforcement officer or a peace officer of
any incorporated municipality or town which has less than
19,000 inhabitants according to the most recent federal
decennial census shall not enforce this section on any
interstate highway.

"(9) Any speed limit set pursuant to this section
 shall be enforced by any municipality or any law enforcement
 officer of a municipality only within the corporate limits of

1 the municipality and not within the police jurisdiction of the 2 municipality."

3 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
