Alabama Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act. 8 \$12-21-80. SHORT TITLE. 9 10 This subdivision may be cited as the Alabama Uniform 11 Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act. 12 \$12-21-81. DEFINITIONS. In this subdivision: 13 (1) "Boundaries of the United States" means the 14 geographic boundaries of the United States, Puerto Rico, the 15 16 United States Virgin Islands, and any territory or insular 17 possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. (2) "Law" includes the federal or a state 18 constitution, a federal or state statute, a judicial decision 19 20 or order, a rule of court, an executive order, and an 21 administrative rule, regulation, or order. 22 (3) "Record" means information that is inscribed on 23 a tangible medium or that is stored in an electronic or other 24 medium and is retrievable in perceivable form. 25 (4) "Sign" means, with present intent to

(A) to execute or adopt a tangible symbol; or

authenticate or adopt a record:

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- 1 (B) to attach to or logically associate with the 2 record an electronic symbol, sound, or process.
 - (5) "State" means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, or any territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.
 - (6) "Sworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record given under oath. The term includes a sworn statement, verification, certificate, and affidavit.
 - (7) "Unsworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record that is not given under oath, but is given under penalty of perjury.

\$12-21-82. APPLICABILITY.

This subdivision applies to an unsworn declaration by a declarant who at the time of making the declaration is physically located outside the boundaries of the United States whether or not the location is subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. This subdivision does not apply to a declaration by a declarant who is physically located on property that is within the boundaries of the United States and subject to the jurisdiction of another country or a federally recognized Indian tribe.

\$12-21-83. VALIDITY OF UNSWORN DECLARATION.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), if a law of this state requires or permits use of a sworn declaration, an unsworn declaration meeting the requirements

1 of this subdivision has the same effect as a sworn 2 declaration. (b) This subdivision does not apply to: 3 (1) a deposition; (2) an oath of office; 5 (3) an oath required to be given before a specified 6 7 official other than a notary public; (4) a declaration to be recorded pursuant to Title 8 35; 9 10 (5) an oath required by Sections 43-8-132 and 43-8-133; or 11 12 (6) a durable power of attorney executed pursuant to 13 Chapter 1 of Title 26. \$12-21-84. REQUIRED MEDIUM. 14 15 If a law of this state requires that a sworn declaration be presented in a particular medium, an unsworn 16 17 declaration must be presented in that medium. \$12-21-85. FORM OF UNSWORN DECLARATION. 18 An unsworn declaration under this subdivision must 19 20 be in substantially the following form: 21 I declare under penalty of perjury under the law of 22 the State of Alabama that the foregoing is true and correct, 23 and that I am physically located outside the geographic 24 boundaries of the United States, Puerto Rico, the United 25 States Virgin Islands, and any territory or insular possession 26 subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.
