23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding the Prosthetics and
25	Orthotics Act, Sections 34-25A-1 to 34-25A-14, inclusive, an
26	appropriately trained pharmacist licensed in this state or an
27	appropriately trained pharmacy technician registered pursuant

- to Section 34-23-131 of the Code of Alabama 1975, acting under the direct supervision of a pharmacist may provide therapeutic diabetic shoes and inserts.
 - (b) For the purposes of this act, "appropriately trained" means the satisfactory completion of one of the following:

- (1) A course of study that covers fitting and patient management of therapeutic diabetic shoes and inserts that is approved by the National Commission of Orthotic and Prosthetic Education.
- (2) An appropriate manufacturer's training course consisting of fitting of therapeutic shoes with assessment to be completed to prove success.
- (3) A course of study that covers fitting and patient management of therapeutic diabetic shoes and inserts that is approved by a nationally recognized orthotic and prosthetic certification or accreditation organization which has its certification programs recognized by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies.
- (4) A continuing education course offered by the Alabama Pharmacy Association or the Alabama Board of Pharmacy.
- (c) For the purposes of this act, "therapeutic diabetic shoes and inserts" are described by any of the following Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System Codes:
- (1) A5500. For diabetics only, fitting, including follow-up, custom preparation, and supply of off-the-shelf

depth-inlay shoes manufactured to accommodate multi-density inserts, per shoe.

- (2) A5510. For diabetics only, direct formed, compression molded to patient's foot without external heat source, multiple-density inserts prefabricated, per shoe.
 - (3) A5512. For diabetics only, multiple density insert, direct formed, molded to foot after external heat source of 230 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, total contact with patient's foot, including arch, base layer minimum of 1/4 inch material of shore A 35 durometer or 3/16 inch material of shore A 40 durometer, or higher, prefabricated, each.
 - (4) A5513. For diabetics, multiple density insert, custom molded from model of patient's foot, total contact with patient's foot, including arch, base layer minimum of 3/16 inch materials of shore A 35 durometer, or higher, includes arch filler and other shaping material, custom fabricated, each.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
