11 Section 1. Two or more volunteer fire departments 12 certified by the Alabama Forestry Commission may enter into 13 contracts or agreements pursuant to this section to establish 14 a workers' compensation pool to provide for the payment of 15 workers' compensation claims pursuant to Title 25, Chapter 5, Code of Alabama 1975, on a cooperative or contract basis or 16 17 may jointly form a nonprofit corporation or enter into a trust agreement to carry out this section in their behalf directly 18 or by contract with a private party. A workers' compensation 19 20 pool established pursuant to this section may provide coverage 21 for workers' compensation, employers' liability, and 22 occupational disease claims. The Department of Industrial 23 Relations by rule may adopt requirements for the 24 administration of a workers' compensation pool under this 25 section, including separation or commingling of funds, accounting, auditing, reporting, actuarial standards, and 26 27 procedures.

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Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
