BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 9 10 Section 1. Sections 14-6-1 and 36-22-3, Code of 11 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "§14-6-1. 12 13 "The sheriff has the legal custody and charge of the 14 jail in his or her county and all prisoners committed thereto, except in cases otherwise provided by law. The sheriff may 15 16 employ persons to carry out his or her duty to operate the 17 jail and supervise the inmates housed therein for whose acts 18 he or she is civilly responsible. Persons so employed by the 19 sheriff shall be acting for and under the direction and supervision of the sheriff and shall be entitled to the same 20 21 immunities and legal protections granted to the sheriff under 22 the general laws and the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as 23 long as such persons are acting within the line and scope of 24 their duties and are acting in compliance with the law. "§36-22-3. 25

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1	"(a) It shall be the duty of the sheriff:
2	"(1) To execute and return the process and orders of
3	the courts of record of this state and of officers of
4	competent authority with due diligence when delivered to him
5	or her for that purpose, according to law.
6	"(2) To attend upon the circuit courts and district
7	courts held in his or her county when in session and the
8	courts of probate, when required by the judge of probate, and
9	to obey the lawful orders and directions of such courts.
10	(3) To, three days before each session of the
11	circuit court in his or her county, render to the county
12	treasury or custodian of county funds a statement in writing
13	and on oath of the moneys received by him or her for the
14	county, specifying the amount received in each case, from whom
15	and pay the amount to the county treasurer or custodian of

18	necessary, ferret out crime, apprehend and arrest criminals

"(b) Any of the duties of the sheriff set out in 1 2 subsection (a) or as otherwise provided by law may be carried 3 out by deputies, reserve deputies, and persons employed as authorized in Section 14-6-1 as determined appropriate by the 4 5 sheriff in accordance with state law. Persons undertaking such duties for and under the direction and supervision of the 6 sheriff shall be entitled to the same immunities and legal 7 8 protections granted to the sheriff under the general laws and the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as long as he or she is 9 10 acting within the line and scope of his or her duties and is 11 acting in compliance with the law."

Section 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 14-6-1, 32-7-23, and 36-22-3 of the Code of Alabama 14 1975, nothing in this act shall serve as a bar to an 15 individual's or entity's recovery under the uninsured motorist 16 coverage of the individual or entity, or prevent an insured 17 from being legally entitled to recover damages under the 18 uninsured motorist coverage of the insured.

Section 3. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
