SYNOPSIS: Under current law, the State Purchasing 8 Division of the Department of Finance is not 9 10 required to maintain a statewide database of each 11 request for a bid or proposal for a public contract 12 by the State of Alabama, a political subdivision, 13 an agency, board, commission, or department of the 14 state, the State Board of Education, a public 15 college or trade school, or a public university.

16 This bill would require the State Purchasing 17 Division of the Department of Finance to maintain a 18 statewide database for each request for a bid or 19 proposal by the State of Alabama, a political 20 subdivision, an agency, board, commission, or 21 department of the state, the State Board of 22 Education, a public college or trade school, or a 23 public university for public contracts.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT To require the State Purchasing Division of the Department of Finance to maintain a statewide database of each request for a bid or proposal for a public contract by the State of Alabama, a political subdivision, an agency, board, commission, or department of the state, the State Board of Education, a public college or trade school, or a public university.

(a) The State Purchasing Division of the 11 Department of Finance shall establish and maintain and post on 12 the Internet a statewide database of each request for a bid or 13 proposal for a public contract by the State of Alabama, a 14 political subdivision, an agency, board, commission, or 15 department of the state, the State Board of Education, a 16 public college or trade school, or a public university.

(b) The database shall be a public record and may be
viewed by any citizen, either in person or via the Internet.
The department shall make its database accessible through the
Internet.

(c) Each request for a bid or proposal shall remain
available on the website until the last posting date required
by law has expired.

24 (d) There shall not be a charge for access to the25 database.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
