BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

"Sec. 276. Appointment of adjutant general, general officers and governor's staff.

"The governor shall, with the advice and consent of the senate, shall appoint the adjutant general and all general officers. A person may not be appointed a general officer unless the person is a registered voter in this state. The governor shall appoint his own staff, as may be provided by law."

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Τ	Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
2	assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
