1 application for a new facility within 180 days, or the 2 proposal or application would be deemed denied. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 3 Section 1. Section 22-27-48, Code of Alabama 1975, 4 is amended to read as follows: 5 "\$22-27-48. 6 7 "(a) In addition to any regulatory bodies, the governing body of a county or municipality has a 8 responsibility for and the authority to assure the proper 9 10 management of solid wastes generated within its jurisdiction 11 in accord with its solid waste management plan. A governing 12 body may assign territories and approve or disapprove disposal 13 sites in its jurisdiction in accord with the plan approved for 14 its jurisdiction. Such approval or disapproval of services or activities described in the local plan shall be in addition to 15 any other approvals required from other regulatory authorities 16 17 and shall be made prior to any other approvals necessary for the provision of such services, the development of a proposed 18 facility or the modification of permits for existing 19 facilities. The department may not consider an application for 20 21 a new or modified permit for a facility unless such application has received approval by the affected unit of 22 23 local government having an approved plan.

24 "In determining whether to recommend approval of the 25 proposed issuance of or modification of a new or existing 26 solid waste management site, the governing body shall consider 27 each of the following: 1 "(1) The consistency of the proposal with the 2 jurisdiction's solid waste management need as identified in 3 its plan;

4 "(2) The relationship of the proposal to local
5 planned or existing development or the absence thereof, to
6 major transportation arteries and to existing state primary
7 and secondary roads;

8 "(3) The location of a proposed facility in 9 relationship to existing industries in the state that generate 10 large volumes of solid waste, or the relationship to the areas 11 projected for development of industries that will generate 12 solid waste;

"(4) Costs and availability of public services, facilities and improvements required to support a proposed facility and protect public health, safety and the environment;

17 "(5) The impact of a proposed facility on public 18 safety and provisions made to minimize the impact on public 19 health and safety; and

"(6) The social and economic impacts of a proposed facility on the affected community, including changes in property values, and social or community perception.

23 "The application of the plan for local approval 24 shall be accompanied by an application fee payable to the 25 local governing body in an amount equal to 20 percent of the 26 application or permit fee required by the department, but 27 local approval shall not apply to simple renewals of a permit

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which is to be otherwise unchanged. Further, there shall be no 1 2 requirement for local review and approval of permit modifications for the limited purposes of changing liner and 3 4 leachate collection design, changes in waste streams from within the facility's designated service area, changes in 5 6 sequence of fill, changes to incorporate new technology and 7 changes intended to bring a facility into compliance with statutes and regulations. A renewed application for local 8 approval submitted within 18 months of an application being 9 10 denied or rejected by the local governing body shall be 11 accompanied by an application fee payable to the local 12 governing body in an amount equal to 50 percent of the 13 application or permit fee required by the department.

14 "Any determination by the local governing body of 15 the proposed issuance of or modification of a permit for a new 16 or existing solid waste management site or the proposal to 17 contract for any services described in the solid waste 18 management plan, shall be made in a public meeting only after 19 public notice of such application or proposal and an 20 opportunity for public comment is provided.

"In providing public notice of any application or proposal regarding any services described in the solid waste management plan, the local government shall at a minimum hold at least one public hearing thereon, notice of the time and place of which shall be given by one publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the municipality and in the official gazette, if any, of the jurisdiction.

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1 Furthermore, such notice shall be given at least 30 days but 2 not more than 45 days prior to the proposed date of the hearing. Each notice published in compliance with this section 3 4 shall contain at a minimum a description of the proposed action to be considered, its relevance to and consistency with 5 6 the local solid waste management plan and shall identify a 7 contact person from whom interested persons can obtain additional information and can review copies of both the local 8 plan and the application or proposal to be considered. All 9 10 pertinent documents shall be available for inspection during normal business hours at a location readily accessible to the 11 12 public. Within Except as provided herein for an application or proposal for a new facility, within 90 days of receiving an 13 14 application or proposal, the local governing body shall either 15 approve the application or deny the application setting forth the reasons therefor. The failure of the local governing body 16 17 to act on the proposal within 90 days of receiving the application shall constitute approval by the local governing 18 body. Within 180 days of receiving an application or proposal 19 for a new facility, the local governing body shall either 20 21 approve the application or deny the application setting forth 22 the reasons therefor. The failure of the local governing body to act on the application or proposal for a new facility 23 within 180 days of receiving the application or proposal shall 24 constitute denial by the local governing body. 25

"(b) Following local review and approval of any
 proposal regarding services or activities described in the

1 local solid waste management plan, the applicant shall obtain 2 a statement of consistency from the regional planning and development commission. Therein, the commission shall evaluate 3 4 the proposal using the provisions of the current regional solid waste management needs assessment. In particular, the 5 6 regional commission shall evaluate the proposal as it relates 7 to available existing capacity within the region and the projected lifetime of such capacity. The evaluation shall also 8 identify any proposed capacity which is in excess of expected 9 10 regional needs. No statement of consistency shall be required for contracts exclusively for the collection or transportation 11 12 of solid wastes.

13 "(c) Plans required by this section shall not apply 14 to industrial landfills receiving wastes generated on site 15 only or by the permittee."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
