17	To create an additional circuit judgeship in the
18	Twenty-seventh Judicial Circuit; and to provide for the
19	election of the first judge to fill the position at the
20	general election in 2012.
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. There is created an additional circuit
23	judgeship for the Twenty-seventh Judicial Circuit which shall
24	be designated judgeship number 3. This judgeship shall be
25	filled by election at the general election in 2012 following
26	its preclearance under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of
27	1965, 42 U.S.C. § 1973c. The first judge elected pursuant to

this section shall serve for a six-year term, holding office from the first Monday following the second Tuesday in January after the general election at which that judge is elected.

4 Section 2. The judge elected as provided in Section 5 1 shall have and shall exercise all the jurisdiction, power, 6 rights, and authority and shall possess all of the 7 qualifications, perform all of the duties, and shall be 8 subject to all of the responsibilities and duties of the 9 office to which other circuit judges are subject.

10 Section 3. The annual compensation of the circuit 11 judge appointed or elected pursuant to this act shall be in 12 accordance with Chapter 10A, Title 12, Code of Alabama 1975, 13 including, but not limited to, the provisions that no circuit 14 judge first elected or appointed to office after October 1, 15 2001, shall be provided a salary supplement or expense 16 allowance.

Section 4. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
