2 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited 3 as the Three Feet Please Act.

Section 2. (a) When overtaking and passing a bicycle proceeding in the same direction, a person driving a motor vehicle shall pass to the left and exercise due care by leaving a safe distance between the motor vehicle and the bicycle of not less than three feet until the motor vehicle is safely past the overtaken bicycle.

- (b) (1) A person who violates this act with the violation resulting in a collision causing serious physical injury to another person shall be subject to a civil penalty in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500), in addition to any other penalties as prescribed by law.
- (2) A person who violates this act with the violation resulting in a collision causing death to another person shall be subject to a civil penalty of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000), in addition to any other penalties as prescribed by law.
- (c) Subsection (b) does not apply to a bicyclist who is injured in a vehicular traffic lane when a designated bicycle lane or path is present and passable.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
