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ENROLLED, An Act,

3 Relating to Madison County; to amend Section 1 of Act No. 80-277, 1980 Regular Session (Acts 1980, p. 366), as 4 5 last amended by Act No. 2007-320, 2007 Regular Session (Acts 6 2007, p. 574), to provide further for the distribution of Madison County's share of payments made by the Tennessee 7 8 Valley Authority to the state in-lieu-of-taxes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 9 Section 1. Section 1 of Act No. 80-277, 1980 Regular 10 11 Session (Acts 1980, p. 366), as last amended by Act No. 2007-320, 2007 Regular Session (Acts 2007, p. 574), is further 12 13 amended to read as follows: "Section 1. A. Pursuant to the authority granted by 14 Section 40-28-2, Code of Alabama 1975, Madison County's share 15 16 of payments made by the Tennessee Valley Authority to the state in lieu of ad valorem taxes shall be distributed in the 17 18 following manner: 19 "1. Up to one percent of such payments each year 20 shall be used to establish, equip, and maintain a legislative 21 delegation office. All decisions concerning the Madison County 22 Legislative Office, including, but not limited to, revenue, 23 income, or purchases shall be made by resolutions of the 24 delegation adopted by a concurrent majority of the Madison 25 County delegation, Senators and House of Representative

members, each house voting separately. Such resolution may 1 2 provide an operation procedure for the delegation office. The 3 Madison County Commission shall immediately pay such amounts from such funds as the Madison County legislative delegation 4 5 may request. Such requests shall be in the form of a 6 resolution passed by the county legislative delegation, signed by one Senator and one Member of the House of Representatives 7 8 from the county who shall be duly appointed by the legislative delegation. The legislative delegation shall expend such 9 monies to employ staff, acquire adequate physical office 10 11 space, equipment, supplies, services, and all other necessary 12 items and may also expend the monies for other county purposes 13 at the discretion and direction of the legislative delegation. 14 The persons employed and expenditures of the funds by the 15 legislative delegation shall be in their discretion. Any funds 16 allocated but not spent at the end of the fiscal year, in 17 accordance with this subsection, shall not revert to the 18 general fund of the county treasury, but shall be carried 19 forward and shall remain available year to year for 20 expenditure. The revenue and expenditures of the legislative office shall be audited on an annual basis. 21

"In addition to its annual budget allocation, the legislative delegation is authorized to receive a separate allocation for extraordinary purchase of equipment, not to

exceed 10 percent of its budget allocation. It is understood this allocation may not be made annually, but only as needed.

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3 "B. The remaining money, disbursed pursuant to the
4 authority granted by Section 40-28-2, Code of Alabama 1975,
5 shall be prorated in the following manner:

"1. Seventy percent of the remaining money shall be 6 7 distributed among the county school system and the municipal 8 school systems on the basis of average daily attendance of each school system as it bears to the total average daily 9 attendance of all county and municipal school systems based on 10 11 the number of students residing within the county. Beginning October 1, 2000, of this amount received by the City of 12 Madison school system, forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) shall 13 be expended annually at Bob Jones High School in the City of 14 Madison on outdoor athletic facilities, extracurricular 15 16 equipment, athletic fields, or stadiums and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) shall be expended for the City of Madison 17 18 middle schools for outdoor athletic facilities, including 19 athletic fields or extracurricular equipment. Of this amount 20 received by the county, two hundred fifty thousand dollars 21 (\$250,000) shall be expended annually by the county school 22 system on outdoor athletic facilities, including athletic 23 fields or stadiums. Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, 24 the funds provided to the county school system pursuant to the preceding sentence for outdoor athletic facilities shall be 25

expended annually as follows: forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) 1 shall be expended at each of the current five high schools in 2 3 the county school system for outdoor athletic facilities, including athletic fields or stadiums, and fifty thousand 4 5 dollars (\$50,000) which shall be distributed to the middle schools in the county school system and expended for outside 6 athletic facilities, including athletic fields. Any funds 7 8 currently being held on February 1, 2006, for matching purposes at middle schools shall be released to the middle 9 school for which the funds were being held without regard to 10 11 any matching funds for outside athletic facilities, including 12 athletic fields. Upon a request by an individual school and 13 its athletic booster club or association, the Madison County Board of Education or the Madison City Board of Education, 14 within its respective school system, may pledge funds provided 15 16 pursuant to this paragraph for high school athletic fields or stadiums as collateral for securing loans for the construction 17 18 of new outdoor athletic fields or stadiums.

19 "Notwithstanding the foregoing, for the first fiscal 20 year following the effective date of this act, the county 21 school system shall reimburse any municipal school system in 22 the amount of three-fourths of any loss incurred by that 23 municipal school system under this section. For the second 24 fiscal year following the effective date of this act, the 25 county school system shall reimburse any municipal school

system in the amount of one half of any loss incurred by that 1 2 municipal school system under this section. For the third 3 fiscal year following the effective date of this act, the county school system shall reimburse any municipal school 4 5 system in the amount of one fourth of any loss incurred by that municipal school system under this section. Any 6 reimbursements made pursuant to this section shall be made 7 8 prior to any transfers of money to any municipal school system pursuant to this act. 9

10 "2. Nine percent of the remaining money shall be11 paid to the Madison County General Fund.

12 "3. One percent shall be allocated to municipal 13 schools on academic alert or academic caution as determined by 14 the State Superintendent of Education for the first five 15 fiscal years following the effective date of Act 97-852 and 16 thereafter the one percent shall be allocated pursuant to B.1.

17 "4. Nineteen and one-half percent of the remaining 18 money shall be paid to the City of Huntsville General Fund of 19 which 15 percent shall be earmarked to the Huntsville City 20 School System.

"5. One-half percent of the remaining money shall be paid to the incorporated municipalities within Madison County on a per capita basis. Payments shall be distributed in the following manner:

"(a) Sixty-five percent to the county school system
to be paid by the municipal governing body directly to the
school system.

4 "(b) Thirty-five percent to the municipal general 5 fund.

"C. Provided, however, notwithstanding the 6 7 foregoing, the three percent increase to be distributed to 8 Madison County pursuant to Act 2006-655, now appearing as Section 40-28-2, Code of Alabama 1975, shall be paid to the 9 Madison County Delegation Office for the 2007 fiscal year only 10 11 and then to the Madison County Commission to be expended exclusively for road projects as follows: 12 13 "FY 2008 Old Madison Pike Bridges "FY 2009-2010 Extending Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd 14 15 to Memorial Parkway 16 "FY 2011-2012 Winchester Road to Naugher Road 17 "FY 2013 King Drake to U.S. 431 Connector 18 "FY 2014-2015 U.S. 431 Bridges 19 "FY 2016 Jeff Road-University Drive to Capshaw Road 20 "FY 2017 Zierdt Road-Madison Blvd to Martin Road. 21 In any fiscal year in which any of the 22 aforementioned road projects are not begun or completed, the 23 funds for such projects shall be placed in a separate escrow 24 account to be used exclusively for the unfinished or 25 incomplete project.

"D. Notwithstanding the provisions of C. above, all
future growth in excess of two and one-half percent, excluding
the three percent allocation in C. above, shall be distributed
to the Madison County Legislative Delegation Office.

5 "E. Notwithstanding any other provision of this act 6 to the contrary, any increase in funding received by Madison 7 County as a result of any legislation enacted after the 8 effective date of this amendatory act shall be distributed to 9 the Madison County Legislation Delegation Office."

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective 11 immediately following its passage and approval by the 12 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
