23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. There is hereby established, within the
25	Department of Senior Services, the United We Ride Commission.

Section 2. The members of the commission shall 1 2 include all of the following who shall serve for the same term as their appointing authority: 3 4 (1) The Commissioner of the Department of Senior Services. 5 6 (2) The State Health Officer, or his or her 7 designee. (3) The State Superintendant of the Department of 8 9 Education, or his or her designee. 10 (4) The Commissioner of the Alabama Medicaid Agency, or his or her designee. 11 12 (5) The Commissioner of the Department of Human 13 Resources, or his or her designee. 14 (6) The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health, or his or her designee. 15 (7) The Commissioner of the Department of 16 17 Rehabilitation, or his or her designee. (8) The Director of the Department of 18 Transportation, or his or her designee. 19 (9) The Director of the Alabama Department of 20 21 Economic and Community Affairs, or his or her designee. 22 (10) The Director of the Governor's Office of 23 Faith-Based and Community Initiatives, or his or her designee. 24 (11) One member of the House of Representatives, 25 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. 26 (12) One member of the Senate, appointed by the 27 Senate President Pro Tempore.

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(13) One consumer, appointed by the Governor.

2 (14) One representative of the Office of the3 Governor, appointed by the Governor.

4 (15) One at-large member appointed by the Governor,
5 or his or her designee.

6 Section 3. The Commissioner of the Department of 7 Senior Services shall serve as chair. The commissioner shall 8 assign staff to handle all administrative duties related to 9 the commission which shall include keeping minutes and issuing 10 an annual report.

Section 4. The duties of the commission shall include all of the following:

(1) To develop an educational plan for coordinated
human service transportation intended to result in enhanced
customer access, at the local level, for individuals with
disabilities, older adults, and individuals with lower income.

17 (2) To help reduce or eliminate restrictive and
18 duplicative laws, regulations, and programs related to human
19 service transportation.

20 (3) To examine, identify, document, and disseminate
21 successful cost effective strategies in coordinating human
22 service transportation at the federal, state, tribal, and
23 local levels.

(4) To meet at least four times annually and
establish task groups, focus groups, and hold town meetings,
forums, and any other meetings deemed necessary to carry out
the mandates of this act.

1 (5) To submit an annual report to the Governor in 2 November of each year, which shall provide a detailed 3 explanation of the activities of the commission for the 4 preceding 12-month period, and the impact of these activities 5 in addressing the challenges in the coordination of Alabama's 6 public transportation.

Section 5. All cabinet level agencies shall
cooperate to the fullest extent reasonably possible with the
commission and its chair, and shall provide all information
needed by the commission to fulfill its mandate pursuant to
this act.

12 Section 6. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
