15	AN ACT
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17	To amend Section 36-25-3, as amended by Act No.
18	2009-225, 2009 Regular Session (Acts 2009, p. 401), Code of
19	Alabama 1975, relating to the State Ethics Commission, to
20	grant subpoena power to the commission.
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Section 36-25-3, as amended by Act No.
23	2009-225, 2009 Regular Session (Acts 2009, p. 401), Code of
24	Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:
25	"§36-25-3.
26	"(a) There is hereby created a State Ethics
27	Commission composed of five members, each of whom shall be a

1 fair, equitable citizen of this state and of high moral 2 character and ability. The following persons shall not be eligible to be appointed as members: (1) a public official; 3 4 (2) a candidate; (3) a registered lobbyist and his or her principal; or (4) a former employee of the commission. For 5 purposes of this section, a public official shall not be 6 7 deemed to include a part-time municipal judge and a registered lobbyist shall not be deemed to include a person whose 8 lobbying activities are limited to providing public testimony 9 10 to a legislative body or regulatory body or committee thereof. No member of the commission shall be eligible for 11 12 reappointment to succeed himself or herself. The members of 13 the commission shall be appointed by the following officers: 14 the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, or in the absence of a 15 Lieutenant Governor, the Presiding Officer of the Senate, and 16 the Speaker of the House of Representatives and shall assume 17 their duties upon confirmation by the Senate. The members of the first commission shall be appointed for terms of office 18 expiring one, two, three, four, and five years, respectively, 19 from September 1, 1975. Successors to the members of the first 20 21 commission shall serve for a term of five years beginning 22 service on September 1 of the year appointed and serving until 23 their successors are appointed and confirmed. If at any time 24 there should be a vacancy on the commission, a successor 25 member to serve for the unexpired term applicable to such vacancy shall be appointed by the Governor. The commission 26 27 shall elect one member to serve as chair of the commission and

one member to serve as vice chair. The vice chair shall act as
 chair in the absence or disability of the chair or in the
 event of a vacancy in that office.

"Beginning with the first vacancy on the Ethics
Commission after October 1, 1995, if there is not a Black
member serving on the commission, that vacancy shall be filled
by a Black appointee. Any vacancy thereafter occurring on the
commission, shall also be filled by a Black appointee if there
is no Black member serving on the commission at that time.

10 "(b) A vacancy in the commission shall not impair 11 the right of the remaining members to exercise all the powers 12 of the commission, and three members thereof shall constitute 13 a quorum.

"(c) The commission shall at the close of each 14 15 fiscal year, or as soon thereafter as practicable, report to 16 the Legislature and the Governor concerning the actions it has 17 taken, the name, salary, and duties of the director, the names and duties of all individuals in its employ, the money it has 18 disbursed, other relevant matters within its jurisdiction, and 19 such recommendations for legislation as the commission deems 20 21 appropriate.

"(d) Members of the commission shall, while serving on the business of the commission, be entitled to receive compensation at the rate of fifty dollars (\$50) per day, and each member shall be paid his or her travel expenses incurred in the performance of his or her duties as a member of the commission as other state employees and officials are paid

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when approved by the chair. If for any reason a member of the commission wishes not to claim and accept the compensation or travel expenses, the member shall inform the director, in writing, of the refusal. The member may at any time during his or her term begin accepting compensation or travel expenses; however, the member's refusal for any covered period shall act as an irrevocable waiver for that period.

"(e) All members, officers, agents, attorneys, and 8 employees of the commission shall be subject to this chapter. 9 10 The director, members of the commission, and all employees of the commission shall not engage in direct partisan political 11 12 activity, including the making of campaign contributions, on 13 the state, county, and local levels. The prohibition shall in 14 no way act to limit or restrict such persons' ability to vote 15 in any election.

"(f) The commission shall appoint a full-time 16 17 director. The director shall serve at the pleasure of the commission and shall appoint such other employees as needed. 18 All such employees, except the director, shall be employed 19 subject to the provisions of the state Merit System law, and 20 21 their compensation shall be prescribed pursuant to such law. 22 The employment of attorneys shall be subject to subsection 23 (h). The compensation of the director shall be fixed by the commission, payable as the salaries of other state employees. 24 25 The director shall be responsible for the administrative 26 operations of the commission and shall administer this chapter 27 in accordance with the commission's policies. No regulation

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shall be implemented by the director until adopted by the
 commission in accordance with Sections 41-22-1 to 41-22-27,
 inclusive, the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act.

4 "(g) The director may appoint part-time stenographic reporters or certified court reporters, as needed, to take and 5 6 transcribe the testimony in any formal or informal hearing or 7 investigation before the commission or before any person authorized by the commission. The reporters shall not be 8 full-time employees of the commission and shall not be subject 9 10 to the Merit System law and may not participate in the State 11 Retirement System.

12 "(h) The director may, with the approval of the 13 Attorney General, appoint a competent attorney as legal 14 counsel for the commission. The legal counsel shall be of good 15 moral and ethical character, licensed to practice law in this state, and a member in good standing of the Alabama Bar 16 17 Association. The legal counsel shall be commissioned as an assistant or deputy attorney general and shall, in addition to 18 the powers and duties herein conferred, have the authority and 19 duties of an assistant or deputy attorney general, except, 20 21 that his or her entire time shall be devoted to the 22 commission. The attorney shall act as an attorney for the 23 commission in actions or proceedings brought by or against the commission pursuant to any provisions of law under the 24 commission's jurisdiction, or in which the commission joins or 25 intervenes as to a matter within the commission's 26 27 jurisdiction, or as a friend of the court or otherwise;

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1 provided however, nothing in this chapter shall be deemed as a 2 direct grant of subpoena power to the commission. The commission shall have subpoena power. Subpoenas shall be 3 issued only in cases where complaints have been filed that 4 have proceeded beyond the preliminary inquiry stage. In the 5 course of an investigation, the commission may subpoena 6 7 witnesses and compel their attendance, and may also require the production of books, papers, documents, and other 8 evidence. If any person fails to comply with any subpoena 9 10 lawfully issued, or if any witness refuses to produce evidence or to testify as to any matter relevant to the investigation, 11 12 it shall be the duty of any court of competent jurisdiction or the judge thereof, upon the application of the director to 13 compel obedience by attachment proceedings for contempt, as in 14 the case of disobedience of the requirements of a subpoena 15 issued for such court or a refusal to testify therein. A 16 17 subpoena shall be issued only upon the express written 18 authorization of the director.

"(i) The director shall designate in writing the 19 chief investigator, should there be one, and a maximum of six 20 21 full-time investigators who shall be and are hereby 22 constituted law enforcement officers of the State of Alabama 23 with full and unlimited police power and jurisdiction to 24 enforce the laws of this state pertaining to the operation and administration of the commission and this chapter. 25 26 Investigators shall meet the requirements of the Alabama Peace 27 Officers' Standards and Training Act, Sections 36-21-40 to

1 36-21-51, inclusive, and shall in all ways and for all purposes be considered law enforcement officers entitled to all benefits provided in Section 36-15-6(f); provided however such investigators shall only exercise their power of arrest as granted under this chapter pursuant to an order issued by a court of competent jurisdiction."

Section 2. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
