## SYNOPSIS:

 corporation in Alabama may divide territory within its limits into business, industrial, and residential zones or districts and may provide the kind of use of structures within the zone or district.Under existing law, admission to public education is free to all eligible children and youth enrolled in local school systems in which they reside.

This bill would require group homes for children to be pre-approved by the county commission or city council before they may locate within a county in Alabama.

This bill would allow school systems where group homes for children are located to charge another school system for a nonresident's tuition.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Relating to group homes for children; to require pre-approval by the county commission or the city council for the establishment of a group home for children; and to authorize a local school system where a group home is located to be reimbursed for education expenses of a nonresident student.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
Section 1. A group home for children shall receive approval by the county commission or by the city council, when located within a municipality, prior to its establishment within a county or municipality in Alabama.

Section 2. A local school system where a group home is located is authorized to charge a nonresident student's school system for payment of tuition and fees.

Section 3. The provisions of Section 1 shall apply to group homes established after the effective date of this act.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
