1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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- 2 Section 1. For purposes of this act, the following words shall have the following meanings: 3
 - (1) 2-1-1 CALL CENTERS. A statewide network of 14 regional call centers that provide citizens access to health and human services.
- 7 (2) ALL KIDS INSURANCE. An insurance program offered by the Department of Public Health to provide medical, dental, 8 mental health, and substance abuse services for children under 9 10 19 years of age whose household earnings are too high to qualify for Medicaid, but not enough to purchase individual 11 12 health insurance.
 - Section 2. 2-1-1 Call Centers shall become a means by which Alabama residents may use to apply for the All Kids Insurance Program.
 - Section 3. The Department of Public Health in conjunction with the United Way of Alabama shall promulgate rules to implement this act that include, but is not limited to the following:
 - (1) Clearly defined procedures for citizens and call center operators to use during the application process.
 - (2) The use of the print and electronic media to publicize the procedure for the application process.
- Section 4. A one-time appropriation of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is made by the Legislature for the 26 fiscal year 2010-2011 for the implementation of this act.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
