2.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) A county commission or municipal
governing body may not adopt or continue in effect any
ordinance, rule, or resolution regulating the registration,
packaging, labeling, sale, distribution, or application of
fertilizers. The entire subject matter of the foregoing shall
be subject to the jurisdiction of the Department of
Agriculture and Industries.

- "fertilizer" means any substance containing one or more recognized plant nutrients which is used for its plant nutrient content and which is designed for use or claimed to have value in promoting plant growth, except unmanipulated animal and vegetable manures, marl, lime, limestone, wood ashes, boiler ashes produced by the pulp and paper or the electric utility industries, and similar other products exempted by regulation by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries.
- (c) This section shall not affect, supersede, or override any zoning ordinance or business license enacted by a county or municipal government.
- Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
