21	Relating to coroners; to provide that the coroner
22	would store and transport bodies for the purpose of autopsies
23	under certain circumstances; and to provide reimbursement of
24	the expenses incurred for the storage and transfer.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Except where there is an agreement
27	otherwise, the coroner shall be responsible for carrying out

the duties required for proper transportation of a body to a forensic sciences laboratory for the purpose of performing an autopsy ordered pursuant to Section 36-18-2, Code of Alabama 1975. The corner shall be responsible for storage of a body prior to transportation to a forensic sciences laboratory when necessary. Upon receipt of an order issued pursuant to Section 36-18-2, Code of Alabama 1975, the coroner shall coordinate with the Department of Forensic Sciences regarding the storage and transportation of the body to the forensic sciences laboratory designated by the Department of Forensic Sciences.

Section 2. The expenses incurred by the coroner in performing the duties set out herein shall be reimbursed as follows:

- (1) Except as provided in subdivision (2), if the autopsy is ordered as provided in Section 36-18-2, Code of Alabama 1975, the costs incurred for storage and transportation of the body to a facility operated by the Department of Forensic Sciences for the purpose of performing the autopsy shall be borne by the State of Alabama, paid from funds appropriated for the operating expenses of the entity which ordered the autopsy.
- (2) If the order for autopsy issued under Section 36-18-2, Code of Alabama 1975, has been made in response to a request from a person or entity not authorized to order an autopsy under Section 36-18-2, Code of Alabama 1975, the costs incurred for storage and transportation of the body shall be borne by the person or entity making the request. At the time

the order for autopsy is delivered to the coroner, the entity issuing the order shall provide the coroner with sufficient information regarding the person or entity making the request to allow for a statement seeking reimbursement to be submitted to the requestor as provided in Section 3.

Section 3. (a) In order to obtain reimbursement of expenses as authorized in this act, the coroner shall itemize the necessary expenses incurred for the storage of the body prior to transportation and for transportation of the body from the county where the deceased died to the designated forensic sciences laboratory. The itemized statement shall be delivered to the county commission by the coroner within 10 days of the date the body is delivered to the designated forensic sciences laboratory.

(b) Upon receipt of the statement from the coroner, the county commission shall prepare and send an itemized statement for reimbursement of expenses to the person or entity responsible for reimbursement as provided in Section 2. Payment shall be remitted to the county commission by the responsible person or entity within 30 days of the date of receipt of the itemized statement.

Section 4. A special fund shall be established in the county treasury for deposit of all reimbursements paid pursuant to this act. The county commission shall maintain the special fund and all monies paid into the account shall be expended only for expenses related to the storage and transportation of bodies for purposes of autopsy as provided,

herein. The coroner shall be responsible for providing the county commission itemized statements of all expenses due to be paid for the costs of storage and transportation of bodies as provided in this act. If the coroner has complied with Section 3, the county commission shall pay the expenses from monies deposited in the special fund created in this section. If the coroner has not complied with Section 3, the county commission shall not be responsible for payment of any expenses.

Section 5. In the event an autopsy is requested by means other than an order issued pursuant to Section 36-18-2, Code of Alabama 1975, the coroner shall not be responsible for the storage or transportation of the body. The coroner may provide the assistance to the person or entity requesting the autopsy if the person or entity pays all expenses incurred by the coroner prior to the services being rendered. Payment shall be made payable to the special fund created in Section 4.

Section 6. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
