8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing constitutional law,
9 lotteries, gift enterprises, and any schemes in the
10 nature of a lottery are prohibited. Bingo has been
11 established by case law to be prohibited by Section
12 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. Specific
13 counties which ratified local constitutional
14 amendments permitting the operation of bingo for
15 certain charitable or educational purposes are
16 removed from the prohibition.

17 This bill would propose a local
18 constitutional amendment for the City of Prichard
19 in Mobile County to permit the operation of bingo
20 by nonprofit organizations for charitable,
21 educational, or other lawful purposes.

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of
2 Alabama of 1901, relating to legalizing certain operations of
3 bingo games for prizes or money for charitable or educational
4 purposes in the City of Prichard in Mobile County.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

6 Section 1. The following amendment to the
7 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become
8 valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of
9 this act are fulfilled:

10 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

11 The operation of bingo games for prizes or money by
12 nonprofit organizations for charitable, educational, or other
13 lawful purposes shall be legal in the City of Prichard in
14 Mobile County. The city council shall promulgate rules and
15 regulations for the licensing and operation of bingo games
16 within the city. The city council shall insure compliance
17 pursuant to any rule or regulation and the following
18 requirements:

19 (1) No person under the age of 19 years shall be
20 permitted to play any game or games of bingo, nor shall any
21 person under the age of 19 years be permitted to conduct or
22 assist in the operation of any game of bingo.

23 (2) No bingo license shall be issued to any
24 nonprofit organization, unless the organization shall have
25 been in existence for at least three years in the city
26 immediately prior to the issuance of the permit or license.

1 (3) Bingo games may be operated on the premises
2 owned or leased by the nonprofit organization operating the
3 bingo game.

4 (4) A nonprofit organization may enter into a
5 contract with any individual, firm, association, or
6 corporation to have the individual or entity operate bingo
7 games or concessions on behalf of the nonprofit organization.
8 A nonprofit organization may pay consulting fees to any
9 individual or entity for any services performed in relation to
10 the operation or conduct of a bingo game.

11 (5) A nonprofit organization may lend its name or
12 allow its identity to be used by another person or entity in
13 the operating or advertising of a bingo game in which the
14 nonprofit organization is not directly and solely operating
15 the bingo game.

16 (6) Prizes given by any nonprofit organization for
17 the playing of bingo games may not exceed the cash amount or
18 gifts of equivalent value set by rule or regulation during any
19 bingo session during any calendar week.

20 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
21 shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the
22 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, and the election laws of this
23 state.

24 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
25 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
26 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the

1 following description of the substance or subject matter of
2 the proposed constitutional amendment:

3 "Relating to the City of Prichard in Mobile County,
4 proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,
5 authorizing the operation of bingo games by nonprofit
6 organizations for charitable, educational, and other lawful
7 purposes.

8 "Proposed by Act _____ . "

9 This description shall be followed by the following
10 language:
