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2	ENROLLED, An Act,			
3	To amend Sections 41-9-410, 41-9-411, and 41-9-413,			
4	Code of Alabama 1975, and to add Sections 41-9-415 and			
5	41-9-416 to the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the Women's			
6	Commission, to alter the duties, responsibilities,			
7	qualifications, funding, and terms of office of members of the			
8	Women's Commission.			
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:			
10	Section 1. Sections 41-9-410, 41-9-411, and			
11	41-9-413, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as			
12	follows:			
13	"\$41-9-410.			
14	"There is hereby created and established a			
15	continuing Women's Commission, hereinafter referred to as the			
16	commission, which shall be composed of three members of the			
17	House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the			
18	House, two members of the Senate appointed by the President			
19	Pro Tem of the Senate and 10 members appointed by the			
20	Governor. Of those members appointed by the governor, one			
21	member shall be appointed from each congressional district as			
22	the same are established on September 20, 1971, and two			
23	members shall be appointed from the state-at-large. At least			
24	seven of the members appointed by the Governor shall be women.			
25	The five members representing the Legislature shall be			

1	appointed for terms of two years, and their successors shall				
2	be appointed for terms of two years. Of those members				
3	appointed by the Governor, five members shall be appointed for				
4	terms of five years, and five members shall be appointed for				
5	terms of three years, and the successors to such 10 appointees				
6	shall serve for terms of three <u>five</u> years.				
7	"Members shall be selected on the basis of their				
8	interests and knowledge in, and their ability to make				
9	contributions to, the solutions of problems related to the				
10	status of women.				
11	"The commission shall report to the Governor and the				
12	Legislature.				
13	"Vacancies on the commission shall be filled by				
14	appointment in the same manner provided for the appointment of				
15	the initial members. Any appointment to replace a member whose				
16	position becomes vacant prior to the expiration of the term				
17	shall be filled only for the remainder of the term.				
18	"Members of the commission shall receive no				
19	compensation for their services, except that they may be				
20	reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incident to				
21	their duties as members of the commission, in accordance with				
22	state law.				
23	"§41-9-411.				
24	"The commission shall hold an organizational session				
25	at which time the commission shall select a chairman and such				

1	other officers from its membership as it deems necessary. The					
2	commission shall at its organizational session adopt such					
3	procedures and rules that will enable the implementation of					
4	the purposes of the commission. It shall have the					
5	responsibility of appointing such committees and task forces					
6	as they deem necessary. Members of such committees shall serve					
7	without compensation. It shall be provided with office space					
8	and necessary office equipment. It may engage employees and					
9	consultants, hold public hearings and generate other					
10	activities as may be needed to realize the purposes of the					
11	commission.					
12	"§41-9-413.					
13	"The commission shall be a continuing vehicle for					
14	the determination of effective policy and legislation in the					
15	areas which will affect Alabama's women. It shall study the					
16	status of women in this state and make recommendations to the					
17	Governor and Legislature for constructive action in the					
18	following areas:					
19	"(1) Public and private employment policies and					
20	practices;					
21	" (2) Labor laws dealing with hours, wages and					
22	working conditions;					
23	" (3) Legal rights and responsibilities;					
24	" (4) Policies and practices with regard to					
25	education, counseling and job training;					

1	" (5) Citizen volunteers; and
2	" (6) Home and community.
3	"The purpose of the commission is to improve and
4	advance the lives of women in the State of Alabama. The
5	commission may study, make recommendations, educate, and
6	promote constructive action on issues related to women which
7	shall include, but not be limited to, economic development,
8	education, employment, health, legal rights, political
9	participation, and the quality of individual and family life.
10	The areas of responsibility may include any or all of the
11	<u>following:</u>
12	" <u>(1) To create public awareness and understanding of</u>
13	the responsibilities, needs, potentials, and contributions of
14	women and their roles in the changing society.
15	"(2) To research, assemble, analyze, and disseminate
16	pertinent data and educational materials relating to
17	activities and programs which will assist in meeting the needs
18	<u>of women.</u>
19	"(3) To institute, conduct, and/or support
20	educational and other programs, meetings, conferences,
21	hearings, forums, and discussion groups to address matters of
22	concern to the women of the state.
23	"(4) To advise and make recommendations to the
24	Governor and to the Legislature on issues, policies, and
25	programs relating to women.

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1	"(5) To evaluate and monitor legislation pending in				
2	the Legislature on issues relating to women and make				
3	recommendations concerning such legislation to the Governor				
4	and the Legislature.				
5	"(6) To maintain contact and collaborate with the				
6	appropriate federal, state, local, and international agencies				
7	concerned with the status of women.				
8	"(7) To perform such other functions and duties as				
9	imposed upon it by law or as are assigned to it by the				
10	Governor or the Legislature, or both."				
11	Section 2. Sections 41-9-415 and 41-9-416 are hereby				
12	added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:				
13	\$41-9-415.				
14	(a) The commission may employ an executive director,				
15	who shall serve at the pleasure of the commission and who				
16	shall be responsible directly to the commission. The				
17	commission shall determine the compensation of the executive				
18	director which shall be paid from the funds of the commission.				
19	The commission shall designate the duties and responsibilities				
20	of the executive director.				
21	(b) The commission may employ administrative				
22	employees, consultants, research assistants, and other				
23	supervisory and professional personnel as may be necessary or				
24	advisable for carrying out in the most efficient and				
25	beneficial manner the purposes and provisions of this article.				

The commission may offer to its employees any benefits offered 1 2 to employes of the State of Alabama, including retirement, 3 medical and dental care, and workers' compensation plans. \$41-9-416. 4 5 (a) The commission shall administer funds allocated for its work and be authorized to accept, disburse, and 6 7 allocate any funds that may become available from other 8 governmental and private sources, provided that all such funds shall be disbursed or allocated in compliance with any 9 10 specific designation stated by the donor. In the absence of such specific designation, the funds shall be disbursed or 11 allocated on projects related to any of the purposes of the 12 13 commission. 14 (b) The commission may impose user fees on 15 participants in its programs, services, or activities. Fees 16 shall not exceed the reasonable cost of administering the 17 programs, services, or activities. The commission or the

18 executive director may waive the user fee if the waiver would 19 promote the purpose of the commission or the participant is 20 unable to pay the user fee.

(c) All user fees collected, sponsorships, direct
appropriations, and other funds received shall be deposited
into a special fund in the State Treasury to be known as the
Women's Commission Fund. The commission may make deposits and
expenditures from such special fund to administer and

implement the purposes of this article, including, but not 1 2 limited to, expenditures for expenses, meals and receptions, 3 awards, and promotional items. All revenue remaining in the special fund at the end of the fiscal year shall carry over to 4 5 the next fiscal year and shall not revert to the State General Fund or any other fund. Such funds shall be appropriated, 6 budgeted and allotted in accordance with Sections 41-4-80 to 7 8 41-4-96, inclusive and 41-19-1 to 41-19-12, inclusive and only in amounts stipulated in general appropriations bills and 9 10 other appropriations bills.

(d) All contributions and gifts of money and property made to the commission shall be exempt from all taxation in the state. All real and personal property, money, income, resources, and activities of the commission shall be exempt from all taxation in the state.

(e) The commission may award research grants in
accordance with state law and subject to budget
appropriations.

(f) The commission shall maintain accurate records
and books of account covering revenue and expenditures, which
shall be subject to audit by the Department of Examiners of
Public Accounts.

(g) The commission shall be provided with officespace and necessary office equipment.

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1	Section 3. This act shall become effective
2	immediately following its passage and approval by the
3	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
