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- Section 1. (a) For purposes of this act, the term

  automated external defibrillator is given the same definition

  as provided in Section 6-5-332.3(c), Code of Alabama 1975.
  - (b) Any person or entity that owns or operates a public establishment that serves or admits in excess of 1,000 people in a period of one month's time shall acquire and maintain at the establishment an automated external defibrillator.
  - (c) (1) The Alabama Department of Public Health shall administer and enforce this section and may adopt necessary administrative rules in this regard.
  - (2) The department may seek injunctive relief to enforce this section.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
