26	Section 1. Property of a person present in this

1 United States, except property needed for the basic living 2 necessities of the person as determined by the local law enforcement agency, acquired by the person directly or 3 indirectly while in violation of the immigration laws of the United States shall be subject to forfeiture in the same 5 manner as provided in Section 20-2-93 of the Code of Alabama 6 7 1975. The forfeiture shall be governed by and shall conform to the procedures set out in Section 28-4-286 through 28-4-290, 8 Code of Alabama 1975, except as modified by Section 20-2-(h), 9 10 Code of Alabama 1975.

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Section 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed as creating a cause of action against the state or any of its agencies, officials, employees, or political subdivisions based on the good faith performance of any duty imposed by this act or good faith failure to perform any duty imposed by this act.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
