Under existing law, certain persons who were former prisoners of war may receive a distinctive license plate based on that service.

This bill would create a new distinctive POW/MIA license plate category for motor vehicles and a new distinctive POW/MIA tag for motorcycles. This bill would provide that the distinctive POW/MIA tag would be of a different design than the POW tag available only to persons who were certified as a POW. This bill would provide that any resident motor vehicle owner could receive the distinctive POW/MIA motor vehicle tag or distinctive motorcycle tag upon payment of an additional fee. This bill would also provide that the additional annual fee would be paid to the Veterans' Assistance Fund in the State Treasury.

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Relating to distinctive motor vehicle license plates and motorcycle license plates; to create a distinctive POW/MIA motor vehicle and motorcycle license plate; to provide that the distinctive license plates would be available to any resident motor vehicle or motorcycle owner upon payment of an additional annual fee; and to provide for the distribution of the proceeds of the additional fee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
Section 1. (a)(1) Notwithstanding Sections 32-6-64, 32-6-65, 32-6-67, and 32-6-68, Code of Alabama 1975, except for the requirements for Quantity Class 2 applications provided herein, upon application to the judge of probate, license commissioner, or other issuing official, compliance with motor vehicle registration and licensing laws, payment of regular fees required by law for license plates for private passenger or pleasure motor vehicles, and payment of an additional annual fee of five dollars (\$5), owners of motor vehicles who are residents of Alabama shall be issued distinctive POW/MIA license plates. These license plates shall be valid for five years, and may then be replaced with either conventional, personalized, or new POW/MIA license plates. The license plate shall not be printed and issued until applications for the quantity required for regular private passenger or pleasure motor vehicle license plates for a Quantity Class 2 license plate are received by the state

Comptroller in the same manner as provided in Section 32-6-64, Code of Alabama 1975.
(2) Upon application to the judge of probate, license commissioner, or other issuing official, compliance with motor vehicle registration and licensing laws, payment of regular fees required by law for motorcycle license plates, and payment of an additional annual fee of five dollars (\$5), owners of motorcycles who are residents of Alabama shall be issued distinctive POW/MIA motorcycle license plates. The license plate shall be valid for five years and may then be replaced with a new conventional, personalized, or POW/MIA motorcycle license plate. Notwithstanding this section, the motorcycle license plates shall only be printed and issued as long as the POW/MIA distinctive license plate qualifies for a distinctive license plate category pursuant to subdivision (1).
(b) Payment of required license fees and taxes for the years during which new license plates are not issued shall be evidenced as provided in Section 32-6-63, Code of Alabama 1975.
(c) The POW/MIA license plates shall be designed by the Department of Veterans' Affairs and approved by the Department of Revenue. The design shall be of a different design than the distinctive POW license plate authorized pursuant to Section 32-6-250, Code of Alabama 1975, and shall contain the term POW/MIA.
(d) The license plates shall be issued, printed, and processed like other distinctive and personalized license plates provided in Chapter 6 of Title 32, Code of Alabama 1975.
(e) The net proceeds of the additional revenues derived from sales of the license plates produced pursuant to this section, less administrative costs, shall be distributed by the judge of probate, license commissioner, or other issuing official to the office of the state Comptroller which shall distribute the proceeds to the Alabama Veterans' Assistance Fund in the State Treasury.
(f) The Department of Revenue may promulgate rules to implement this section.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
