3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Effective for all tax years beginning after December 31, 2008, the sales tax for a pistol, rifle, shotgun, or firearm of any kind, or ammunition therefor may not exceed the sales tax levied on food by the state and local governments at the point of sale. For purposes of this amendment, food is defined as substances, whether in liquid, concentrated, solid, frozen, dried, or dehydrated form, that are sold for ingestion or chewing by humans and are consumed for their taste or nutritional value.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional

amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 1 2 following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment: 3 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, that would provide that the sales tax levied 5 on a pistol, rifle, shotgun, or firearm of any kind, or 6 7 ammunition therefor would not exceed the sales tax levied on food by the state and local governments at the point of sale. 8 "Proposed by Act ____." 9 10 This description shall be followed by the following 11 language: 12 "Yes () No ()."
