20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. Section 3 of Act 2009-616 of the 2009
22	Regular Session (Acts 2009, p. 1779), now appearing as Section
23	13A-10-52 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as
24	follows:

"§13A-10-52.

"(a) It shall be unlawful for a person to

intentionally flee by any means from anyone the person knows

to be a law enforcement officer if the person knows the

officer is attempting to arrest the person.

- "(b) It shall be unlawful for a person while operating a motor vehicle on a street, road, alley, or highway in this state, to intentionally flee or attempt to elude a law enforcement officer after having received a signal from the officer to bring the vehicle to a stop.
- "(c) A violation of subsection (a) or (b) is a Class A misdemeanor unless the flight or attempt to elude causes an actual death or physical injury to an innocent bystanders or bystander, a third parties party, or a law enforcement officer, in which case the violation shall be a Class C felony. In addition, the court shall order the suspension of the driver's license of the defendant for a period of not less than six months nor more than two years."
- (d) The penalties provided in subsection (c) shall not apply if the law enforcement officer is in an unmarked vehicle.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the
