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8 SYNOPSIS: Existing law provides that municipalities 9 with a population of under 2,000 must hold at least 10 one council meeting per month and municipalities 11 with a population of over 2,000 must hold at least 12 two council meetings per month. In order to conduct 13 business at those meetings, a quorum of the elected 14 municipal officials must be present.

Under existing law, there is no provision to remove from office any mayor, council member, or city commissioner who fails to consistently and regularly attend council meetings except by court action for impeachment.

This bill would provide that a mayor, council member, or city commissioner, whose presence would count toward establishing a quorum, who misses all council or commission meetings for 90 consecutive days, would be removed from office by operation of law.

(d) At the next council or commission meeting 6 7 following the date an elected municipal official has been removed from office pursuant to this section, the council or 8 commission may vote to reinstate the elected municipal 9 10 official removed from office as provided herein for any mitigating or extenuating circumstances as determined by a 11 12 majority vote of the remaining voting members of the council or commission, including the mayor if the mayor is a voting 13 14 member of the council as provided by law.

(e) If the council or commission does not reinstate
the removed elected municipal official pursuant to subsection
(d), the council or commission shall fill the vacancy as
provided by law.

(f) This section shall not apply to any elected municipal official whose absence from any council or commission meeting is a result of military service.
