PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Section 6.16, as added by Amendment 328 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 155 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

"6.16. Retirement.

"The legislature shall provide by law for he retirement of judges, including supernumerary judges, with such conditions, retirement benefits, and pensions for them and their dependents as it may prescribe. No person shall be elected or appointed to a judicial officer after reaching the age of seventy 72 years, provided that a judge over the age of seventy 72 may be appointed to the office of supernumerary judge if he is not eligible to receive state judicial retirement benefits."

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
